County of Orange Report on Grant Applications/Awards

The Grants Report is a condensed list of grant requests by County Agencies/Departments that allows the Board of Supervisors to discuss and approve grant submittals in one motion at a Board meeting. County policy dictates that the Board of Supervisors must approve all grant applications prior to submittal to the grantor. This applies to grants of all amounts, as well as to new grants and those that have been received by the County for many years as part of an ongoing grant. Receipt of grants \$50,000 or less is delegated to the County Executive Officer. Grant awards greater than \$50,000 must be presented to the Board of Supervisors for receipt of funds. This report allows for better tracking of county grant requests, the success rate of our grants, and monitoring of County's grants activities. It also serves to inform Orange County's Sacramento and Washington, D.C. advocates of County grant activities involving the State or Federal Governments.

BJA's FY 2023 DNA Capacity Enhancement for Backlog Reduction (CEBR) Program provides funding to States and units of local government with existing crime laboratories to increase the capacity of publicly funded forensic DNA and DNA database laboratories and to process more DNA samples. This program reduces the backlog of forensic and database DNA samples. The Sheriff-Coroner has applied for this program since 2004. In 2020, this CEBR grant was transferred to the Bureau of Justice Assistance from the National Institute of Justice Program catalog.



This grant provides both formula and discretionary allocations aimed at reducing evidence backlogs and improving the quality and timeliness of forensic science and medical examiner services. Awarded agencies may utilize funds to hire additional full-time or part-time laboratory employees to directly perform capacity enhancement-specific activities, such as validating new DNA analysis technologies for the forensic DNA laboratory and/or the laboratory responsible for analysis of DNA database samples. Matching funds are not required.

The Sheriff-Coroner Department plans to fund overtime to process backlogged DNA casework at the Orange County Crime Laboratory, and to purchase new analytical instruments.

A successful award will require the Sheriff-Coroner or designee to return to the Board of Supervisors to accept this grant funding.

The Ranch Plan Planning Area 3 Urban Stormwater Quality Infiltration and Pre-Treatment Basins Project includes facilities for the removal of trash, sediments, heavy metal contaminants and nutrients from the surface runoff generated from the roads in the Ranch Plan Planning Area 3 prior to infiltrating into the groundwater and/or flowing to San Juan Creek.

The Santa Margarita Water District is the lead agency for project implementation and this application is being resubmitted to OCTA for consideration under this year's call for projects. The total project cost is estimated at \$2,992,000. The M2 ECP-1 grant request is for \$500,000 and the required 20% local match is \$100,000. County will be the lead agency for grant

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF ORANGE COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

AUTHORIZING AN APPLICATION FOR FUNDS FOR THE ENVIRONMENTAL CLEANUP, TIER 1 GRANT PROGRAM UNDER ORANGE COUNTY LOCAL TRANSPORTATION ORDINANCE NO. 3 FOR RANCH PLAN PLANNING AREA 3 URBAN STORMWATER QUALITY INFILTRATION AND PRE-TREATMENT BASINS PROJECT ON BEHALF OF THE SANTA MARGARITA WATER DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, Orange County Local Transportation Ordinance No.3, dated July 24, 2006, which is known and cited as the Renewed Measure M Transportation Ordinance and Investment Plan, makes funds available through the Environmental Cleanup Program to help protect Orange County beaches and waterways from transportation-generated pollution (urban runoff) and improve overall water quality.

WHEREAS, the Environmental Cleanup, Tier 1 Grant Program consists of funding purchases and installation of catch basins with Best Management Practices, such as screens, filters, inserts, and other "street-scale" low flow diversion projects.

WHEREAS, the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) established procedures and criteria for reviewing proposals; and

WHEREAS, the County of Orange (County) possesses authority to nominate water quality improvement projects for funding through the Environmental Cleanup, Tier 1 Grant Program that have a transportation pollution nexus, in order to finance and construct the proposed project; and

WHEREAS, by formal action the County Board of Supervisors authorizes the nomination of Ranch Plan Planning Area 3 Urban Stormwater Quality Infiltration and

Pre-Treatment Basins Project, including all understandings and assurances contained therein, and authorizes the person identified as the official representative of the County to act in connection with the nomination and to provide such additional information as may be required; and

WHEREAS, the Santa Margarita Water District will maintain and operate the equipment acquired and installed; and

WHEREAS, the County will give OCTA's representatives access to and the right to examine all records, books, papers, or documents related to the funded Tier 1 Grant Project; and

WHEREAS, the County will cause work on the project to be commenced within a reasonable time after receipt of notification from OCTA and that the project will be carried to completion with reasonable diligence; and

WHEREAS, the County will comply where applicable with provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act, the National Environmental Policy Act, the American with Disabilities Act, and any other applicable federal, state, and/or local laws, rules and/or regulations; and

WHEREAS, the County must include all projects funded by Net Revenues in the County's seven-year Capital Improvement Program as part of the Renewed Measure M Ordinance eligibility requirement; and

MCPs participation in HHIP is voluntary and requires the close coordination with applicable local partners including, but not limited to: local Continuums of Care (CoCs), counties, public health agencies, organizations that deliver housing services (i.e., interim housing, rental assistance, supportive housing, outreach, and prevention/diversion), Providers, county mental health plans, and Drug Medi-Cal and Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery Systems in their efforts to meet the program's goals and to report on measures.

CalOptima Health is the only MCP in Orange County and is voluntarily participating in HHIP. CalOptima Health is eligible to receive up to \$83,755,557 in incentive payments over a two-year period. The HHIP incentive payments are based on Medi-Cal managed care plan performance and demonstrated progress in tackling housing and homelessness needs. To date, CalOptima Health staff has completed the following submissions to DHCS:

- April 2022 Letter of intent to participate in HHIP.
- June 30, 2022 Local homelessness plan that included a brief community needs assessment.

• September 30, 2022 – Investment plan outlining proposed strategies that CalOptima Health would fund in support of achieving program metrics and goals submitted to DHCS.

On December 1, 2022, the CalOptima Health Board of Directors approved Actions related to HHIP, including authorizing CalOptima Health Staff to develop and administer direct grant to the County of Orange's (County) Office of Care Coordination as Collaborative Applicant and Administrative Enty of the Orange County CoC. The grant will provide funding for the following activities in support of local, state and federal guidelines and best practices in addressing homelessness:

- Point In Time Count and Homeless Survey development and implementation,
- Financial incentives for people with current or past experience of homelessness,
- CalAIM coordination of services and integration with the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS).
- Coordinated Entry System (CES) improvements and capacity building,
- CoC resource mapping and navigation guides outlining how people access services and programs in the System of Care, and
- Implementation of Pulse for Good to support in collecting feedback from people experiencing homelessness within emergency shelter programs and homeless service system.

CalOptima Health developed the above-described grant for the Orange County CoC through the solicitation of stakeholder feedback through listening sessions and surveys. The grant will support key infrastructure activities that the Orange County CoC would largely benefit from to improve the delivery of homeless service programing in Orange County.

On March 23, 2023, the Orange County Housing Authority (OCHA) received notification of funding from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in the amount of \$429,864, for the Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS) Program. The funds provided by HUD under the FSS Program are restricted to paying the salary and benefits for four FSS Coordinators.

OCHA's FSS Coordinators provide critical tools that are utilized by Housing Choice Voucher FSS participants to access services and training needed to help increase their income, build assets through an escrow savings account and prepare for homeownership. Their achievements are intended to lead to self-sufficiency and eliminate dependency on public assistance.

In calendar year 2022, 72% or 118 FSS participant households had escrow savings accounts. Six households who graduated from the FSS Program are working full time and received disbursement from their escrow savings accounts totaling \$102,735. Authorizing acceptance of these funds will provide OCHA the funding necessary to continue to administer the FSS Program.
