County of Orange Report on Grant Applications/Awards

The Grants Report is a condensed list of grant requests by County Agencies/Departments that allows the Board of Supervisors to discuss and approve grant submittals in one motion at a Board meeting. County policy dictates that the Board of Supervisors must approve all grant applications prior to submittal to the grantor. This applies to grants of all amounts, as well as to new grants and those that have been received by the County for many years as part of an ongoing grant. Receipt of grants \$50,000 or less is delegated to the County Executive Officer. Grant awards greater than \$50,000 must be presented to the Board of Supervisors for receipt of funds. This report allows for better tracking of county grant requests, the success rate of our grants, and monitoring of County's grants activities. It also serves to inform Orange County's Sacramento and Washington, D.C. advocates of County grant activities involving the State or Federal Governments.

Since 1988, the SWRCB has contracted with the Health Care Agency (HCA) for HCA's Environmental Health Division Hazardous Materials Unit to conduct regulatory oversight for the cleanup of leaking underground storage tanks (USTs) in Orange County (except for the city of Anaheim).

Funds from this agreement provide personnel services, operating costs, and travel expenses necessary to oversee corrective actions and perform regulatory and administrative activities related to unauthorized releases from USTs. Approving acceptance of the award of this grant agreement will continue the local oversight of

cleanup projects at properties contaminated by leaking underground petroleum tanks that impact both local groundwater supplies and public health.

The California Department of State Hospitals (DSH) is administering the Incompetent to Stand Trial (IST) Infrastructure funding to build out the state's capacity of residential treatment homes and facilities. This funding opportunity is open to California counties that commit to contract with DSH for an ongoing diversion and/or community-based restoration (CBR) program. Over the last decade, California has seen significant growth in the number of individuals found IST on felony charges and referred to DSH for restoration of competency treatment. The year-over-year growth in IST referrals from the superior courts to DSH has outpaced the Department's ability to create additional capacity. Despite recent efforts resulting in increased bed capacity, decreased average length of stay, and implementation of county-based treatment programs, this insufficient capacity has led to a large waitlist and extended wait times for IST defendants pending DSH placement.

The purpose of the DSH IST Infrastructure Project is to increase access to diversion and community- based treatment for eligible individuals found IST. This project provides one-time funds specifically designated to develop residential settings in support of these individuals who are participating in either DSH-funded diversion or CBR programs. The proposed funding level sets startup funds at a rate of \$93,750 per bed, which will be provided for each bed in a residence to cover the down payment, renovation, necessary retrofitting, and/or furnishings for staff and patients. The ongoing operational cost will be provided through a separate per-patient rate paid to counties or to service providers, who are responsible for securing client housing and providing wraparound treatment services.

DHS has awarded Orange County's IST Infrastructure proposal for an amount not to exceed \$8,625,000. This amount was formed on a cost of \$93,750 per bed, at up to 92 beds, based on the County's 55 total IST determinations in Fiscal Year 2021–22. HCA can use grant funds to create and implement IST Diversion and CBR Infrastructure Project(s) by June 2028.

DSH requires the Board to adopt Board Authorizing Resolution (BAR) template before HCA can receive the funds. At this time HCA only seeks approval of the grant award notification. HCA will return to the Board to request BAR approval upon BAR template approval from DSH and County Counsel review of BAR.

On April 1, 2025, OC Community Resources/Office on Aging (OCCR/OoA) was notified that the California Department of Aging (CDA) was to award \$107,936 in additional funding for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education/CalFresh Healthy Living (SNAP-Ed/CFHL) portion of the funding, for a new agreement amount of \$1,839,722, through September 30, 2025.

SNAP-Ed/CFHL provides eligible participants with evidence-based, nutrition education and obesity prevention activities. CalFresh funding was awarded by the CDA to OCCR/OoA for the SNAP-Ed/CFHL and the CalFresh Expansion program under a three-year state standard agreement.

Due to the timing of the notification and CDA requirements to complete necessary documentation, the earliest available Board date to submit a request to accept grants is May 6, 2025. OCCR/OoA requests that the County Executive Office accept the retroactive grant award.

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education/CalFresh Healthy Living (SNAP-Ed/CFHL) provides eligible participants with evidence-based, nutrition education and obesity prevention activities. The CalFresh Expansion program seeks to inform older adults aged 60 years and older that they may be eligible for CalFresh benefits through pre-screening, application assistance and outreach activities. On April 1, 2025, OCCR/OoA was notified of additional available funding in the amount of \$107,936. State Standard Agreement No. CF-2223-22, Amendment 2 increases the SNAP-Ed/CFHL portion of the funding by \$107,936 for FFY 2024-25, for a new maximum agreement amount of \$1,839,722. The additional funding will cover staffing costs and program supplies such as refrigerated shelving at food distribution locations.
