Provide a forum for interagency cooperation and coordination in the prevention, detection, treatment and legal processing of child abuse cases.

**TRF uses food drives as a tool to attract individuals to a site where they can be screened and directed to additional services, such as health care and benefit enrollment programs, as well as outreach and educational materials.

TRF is required to provide a minimum of 3,000 person-hours of accredited training to professionals eligible to receive professional Continuing Education Units (CEU) or representative of professional groups indicated by WIC Section 18982.1, each year of the term of the Contract.

The training is meant to ensure professionals have the ability to detect, treat and prevent child abuse and neglect. CEUs can be offered as Continuing Education for social workers, medical professionals, Peace Officer Standards and Training credits, Speech Language Pathologists, Physical Therapists, Teachers or Continuing Legal Education.

*** As of February 29, 2024, TRF has hosted three trainings with 465 attendees for this Fiscal Year, however, many attendees are not licensed professionals and are not eligible to receive CEUs. Additionally, it is believed the target audience of licensed professionals have returned to in-office work and have a variety of other options available to maintain CEU accreditation. TRF is planning to offer additional trainings during the remainder of the year and is hopeful to increase enrollment over the next few months.
