To the Orange County Board of Supervisors,

I am sending you this letter and subsequent documentation to formally enter into the record my disapproval of the current operation of government enforcement actions concerning the "Stay at Home Orders" and "Social Distancing Requirements". I am quite concerned about the government response to COVID-19, and the implementation of World Health Organization 'recommendations' as Executive Action.

The United States of America is a Constitutional Republic, a nation of laws, and of representative government. Individual liberty is a fundamental core value of Constitutional precedent. It takes a trial by jury, to take away an American Citizen's liberty. Executive Orders are not tantamount to Constitutional jurisprudence, in fact they are wholly antithetical.

Attached with this letter is a small repository of information. My intent is to encourage the Orange County Board of Supervisors toward actions that will result in lawsuits against rogue State government officials and State Boards abridging the privileges and liberties of its citizens. While this problem extends into the highest offices of government, we expect a degree of protection provided by our local governments to act as a buffer between an unwitting citizenry, and communist style authoritarianism.

This is not something that should be swept under the rug of happenstance and lost to the winds of time. The people of California, specifically Orange County, deserve your help in getting justice for crimes committed against them.

UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION

Amendment XIV

Section 1.

All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and of the state wherein they reside. No state shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any state deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws.

Title 18, U.S.C., Section 241

If two or more persons conspire to injure, oppress, threaten, or intimidate any person in any State, Territory, Commonwealth, Possession, or District in the free exercise or enjoyment of any right or privilege secured to him by the Constitution or laws of the United States, or because of his having so exercised the same; ... They shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than ten years, or both; and if death results from the acts committed in violation of this section or if such acts include kidnapping or an attempt to kidnap, aggravated sexual abuse or an attempt to commit aggravated sexual abuse, or an attempt to kill, they shall be fined under this title or imprisoned for any term of years or for life, or both, or may be sentenced to death.

Title 18, U.S.C., Section 242

Whoever, under color of any law, statute, ordinance, regulation, or custom, willfully subjects any person in any State, Territory, Commonwealth,
Possession, or District to the deprivation
of any rights, privileges, or immunities
secured or protected by the Constitution or laws of the United States, or to different punishments, pains, or penalties, on account of such person being an alien, or by reason of his color, or race, than are prescribed for the punishment of citizens, shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than one year, or both; and if bodily injury results from the acts committed in violation of this section or if such acts include the use, attempted use, or threatened use of a dangerous weapon, explosives, or fire, shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than ten years, or both; and if death results from the acts committed in violation of this section or if such acts include kidnapping or an attempt to kidnap, aggravated sexual abuse, or an attempt to commit aggravated sexual abuse, or an attempt to kill, shall be fined under this title, or imprisoned or any term of years or for life, or both, or may be sentenced to death.
