

This Annual Operating Plan is made and agreed to as of the last date signed below and is for the estimated period beginning October 1, 20198 and ending September 30, 202019.

B. Reimbursement for all types of enforcement activities shall be at the following rates included in Attachment A.

#### **PATROL ACTIVITIES:**

- A. Time schedules for patrols will be flexible to allow for emergencies, other priorities, and day-to-day needs of both Cooperator and the U.S. Forest Service. Ample time will be spent in each area to make residents and visitors aware that lawenforcement officers are in the vicinity.
  - Patrol on the following Forest Service roads: Black Star, Main Divide, Maple Springs, Harding, Trabuco Canyon, Verdugo Canyon, and Long Canyon.
  - Patrol in the following campgrounds, developed sites, or dispersed areas: Silverado, Lower San Juan Picnic Area, San Juan Hot Springs, Blue Jay Campground, and Falcon Campground.
- B. The U.S. Forest Service Patrol Captain will determine designated patrol activities and locations for the rural areas of the Cleveland National Forest. No patrol activity will be performed related to this agreement unless specifically requested by the U.S. Forest Service Patrol Captain or his designee. Deputies may be paired with U.S. Forest Service Law Enforcement Officers or another deputy.
  - They shall be assigned to operate in the Cleveland National Forest, as mutually agreed, providing vehicular patrols and other law enforcement and emergency services and

support to other <del>U.S.</del> Forest Service Officers. Each shift shall include briefing time, vehicle preparation time, mealtime and completion of required paperwork.

C. Scheduling requests for deputies shall be at least seven (7) days in advance of the assignment date. The U.S. Forest Service shall make the request through the Operations Office of the North and/or South Operations, attention: Division Commander. The U.S. Forest Service shall specify dates of assignment, shift duration, reporting location and personnel contact.

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: \$5,000.00

#### III. TRAINING:

See Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement Provision IV-K for additional information.

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: 10% of the total Agreement and shall be approved by the U.S. Forest Service (Designated Representative or Alternate Representative).

### **IV. EQUIPMENT:**

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: 10% of the total Agreement, or by authorization of the U.S. Forest Service (Designated Representative or Alternate Representative) if greater expenditures are necessary. All expenditures in this category shall be approved by the U.S. Forest Service (Designated Representative or Alternate Representative).

The estimated useful life of the equipment under the law enforcement agreement provisions IV-J and IV-D (5) shall be provided at the time the documents are filed.

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: (10% of the total)

#### V. SPECIAL ENFORCEMENT SITUATIONS:

- A. Special Enforcement Situations include but are not limited to: Fire Emergencies, Drug Enforcement, and certain Group Gatherings.
- B. Funds available for special enforcement situations vary greatly from year to year and must be specifically requested and approved prior to any reimbursement being authorized. Requests for funds should be made to the U.S. Forest Service designated

representative listed in Item I-A of\_this Annual Operating Plan. The designated representative will then notify Cooperator whether funds will be authorized for reimbursement. If funds are authorized, the parties will then jointly prepare a revised Annual Operating Plan.

- 1. Drug Enforcement: This will be handled on a case by case basis. The request will normally come from the Patrol Captain; however, it may come from the Special Agent in Charge or their designated representative. Reimbursement shall be made at the rates specified in Section 1-B. Deputies assigned to the incident will coordinate all of their activities with the designated officer in charge of the incident.
- 2. Fire Emergency: During emergency fire suppression situations and upon request by the U.S. Forest Service pursuant to an incident resource order, the Cooperator agrees to provide special services beyond those provided under Section II-A, within the Cooperator's resource capabilities, for the enforcement of State and local laws related to the protection of persons and their property. The Cooperator will be compensated at the rate specified in Section 1-B; the U.S. Forest Service will specify times and chedules. Upon concurrence of the local Patrol Captain or their designated representative, an official from the Incident Management Team managing the incident, Cooperator personnel assigned to an incident where meals are provided will be entitled to such meals.
- 3. Group Gatherings: This includes but is not limited to situations which are normally unanticipated or which typically include very short notices, large group gatherings such as rock concerts, demonstrations, and organization rendezvous. Upon authorization by a U.S. Forest Service representative listed in Section I-A for requested services of this nature, reimbursement shall be made at the rates specified in Section 1-B. Deputies assigned to this type of incident will normally coordinate their activities with the designated officer in charge of theincident.

This includes but is not limited to situations which are normally unanticipated or which typically include very short notice, large group gatherings such as rock concerts, demonstrations, and organizational rendezvous.

# VI. BILLING FREQUENCY:

See Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement Provisions 11-H and 111-Bfor additional information.

The Cooperator will furnish the U.S. Forest Service with itemized monthly statements for expenditures. The statement shall be in sufficient detail to allow the U.S. Forest Service to tie these expenditures back to reimbursable expenses and the rate schedule and shall be certified by the County of Orange as being current and proper. These statements must be accompanied by a Law Enforcement Activity Report, form FS-5300-5, filled out as
