County of Orange Report on Grant Applications/Awards

The Grants Report is a condensed list of grant requests by County Agencies/Departments that allows the Board of Supervisors to discuss and approve grant submittals in one motion at a Board meeting. County policy dictates that the Board of Supervisors must approve all grant applications prior to submittal to the grantor. This applies to grants of all amounts, as well as to new grants and those that have been received by the County for many years as part of an ongoing grant. Receipt of grants \$50,000 or less is delegated to the County Executive Officer. Grant awards greater than \$50,000 must be presented to the Board of Supervisors for receipt of funds. This report allows for better tracking of county grant requests, the success rate of our grants, and monitoring of County's grants activities. It also serves to inform Orange County's Sacramento and Washington, D.C. advocates of County grant activities involving the State or Federal Governments.

The Office of Care Coordination is requesting the retroactive grant application authorization for the County of Orange's (County) Office of Care Coordination Proposition 47 Grant Program: Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act, Cohort 5 Request for Proposals in the amount of \$8,000,000.

The Proposition 47 Grant Program: Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act, Cohort 5 Request for Proposals was released on April 11, 2025. The Office of Care Coordination plans to apply by the June 23, 2025, due date with a proposal for a program that will provide coordination services to individuals diverted through Proposition 36.

This grant award authorization form is being submitted for a retroactive approval by your Honorable Board of Supervisors. The Office of Care Coordination was exploring different proposals that would augment the County's resources and services for Proposition 36 in a way that was complementary and not duplicative to any Proposition 47 proposals that may be submitted by other County departments. This required additional meetings and coordination, and given the timing of the Board of Supervisors meetings, the grant application authorization is being submitted following the submission deadline. If awarded, the grant term will be October 1, 2025, through June 30, 2029.

Proposition 47 grant funds must be used for mental health services, substance use disorder treatment, diversion programs, or some combination thereof for people that have been arrested, charged with, or convicted of a criminal offense and have a history of mental health or substance use disorders. In addition to these required services and programs, applicants are encouraged to provide supplemental housing-related services and other community-based supportive services, such as job skills training, case management, and civil legal services. The grant can fund programs that serve adults and/or juveniles. Public agency applicants will be allowed to implement new services or programs and/or expand existing services or programs. The grant offers two funding thresholds for applicants. One: Small Scope Project Up to \$2 million for the entire grant period. Two: Large Scope Project: More than \$2 million and up to \$8 million for the entire grant period.

The Office of Care Coordination intends to apply for a program that will provide coordination services to individuals diverted through Prop 36 and who are not in custody while awaiting placement into treatment, ensuring that they receive services to support increased successful completion of Prop 36 requirement, and resources to encourage long-term stability and reduced recidivism.

Since 2006, the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) has offered local governments that provide health care the opportunity to secure additional Medi-Cal revenues by participating in a voluntary Intergovernmental Transfer (IGT) program with their local Medi-Cal managed care plan. Orange County Health Authority dba CalOptima (CalOptima) is the Medi-Cal managed care plan that services Orange County, CA.

The federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) provides a rate range for Medi-Cal managed care services, but the actual reimbursement rates that plans receive are set by the DHCS. The difference

between the federal allowable rate and state actual rate represents the potential amount of federal reimbursement that counties can claim through a rate range IGT to offset the cost of uncompensated health care provided by the county health departments, public hospitals, and other local care providers.

The OC Health Care Agency (HCA) was invited by CalOptima to participate in an IGT to obtain federal reimbursement for uncompensated health care provided to their patients during the service period of January 1, 2024, to December 31, 2024. The reimbursement by CMS is a dollar-for-dollar match of non-federal funds, which combined covers the cost of eligible healthcare expenditures incurred. HCA estimates \$7,000,000 million in federal matching funds above the original match of health realignment funds for a total funding amount of \$11,600,000.

Because the federal funding is intended to offset Public Health expenditures, all funds received will be used to support Public Health initiatives in Orange County. Funds received by HCA will offset net County costs to support Public Health Services that promote health and prevent the spread of communicable diseases.





The purpose of the PATH Justice-Involved Round 4 grant (known as Justice-Involved Reentry Initiative Capacity Building Program) is to assist participating entities in the delivery and provision of the CalAIM Justice Reentry Demonstration Initiative. The demonstration initiative aims to address the needs of incarcerated beneficiaries as

they near the end of their incarceration and re-enter the community. Round 4 funding gives Correctional Facilities the opportunity to request additional funding for needs not identified in Round 3 planning.

The grant application will provide funding to support the provision of the 90-day pre-release implementation processes and the Justice-Involved Reentry initiative planning effort. DHCS envisions the 90-day Pre-Release Services as part of the CalAIM Justice-Involved Reentry Demonstration initiative, which is mandatory per federal and state law. In addition, the grant will provide funding to the collaborative planning effort with Health Care Agency (HCA), including Correctional Health Services (CHS), and Behavioral Health Services (BHS) to identify stand up processes, protocols, personnel, and IT system modification necessary to support the delivery of pre-release and re-entry planning processes.

The funding will be used for planning activities required to demonstrate Probation is prepared for implementation for the 90-day Pre-Release Services that are now expected to go live in April 2026.

The intent of providing 90-day Pre-Release Services is to allow Medi-Cal enrollment assistance and pre-release coverage for certain services to promote continuity of care and to facilitate successful care transitions upon re-entry to communities. The objective is to help in building a bridge to community-based care for justice-involved Medi-Cal members, offering them services to stabilize their conditions and establishing a re-entry plan for their community-based care to improve care transitions.

PATH Round 4 funding distribution will be received as a percentage of total awarded funds based on several milestones, including approval of the application (50%), interim progress report (40%), and final progress report (10%). Only one application will be submitted to DHCS.

The Orange County Sheriff's Department (OCSD) monitors various ABC-licensed establishments where the overserving and overconsumption of alcohol leaves room for catastrophic repercussions, including increased crime and the deterioration of the surrounding community. Greater incidences of drug dealing, underage drinking, assaults, and other public disturbances are just some of the issues the department is combating. To reduce these dangerous ramifications, the department plans to schedule overtime for five existing positions to survey parking lots, collect data, and prevent repeated crimes outside several establishments. OCSD intends to set-up Minor Decoy Programs to inspect those suspected of contributing to these crimes through excessive distribution of

alcohol. The grant funds will enable OCSD to create proactive strategies to target and enforce crime prevention operations to stop the fallouts of public intoxication. This initiative will also support law enforcement officers and professional staff training to ensure that staff are up to date on ABC education throughout the grant performance period. It will also ensure proper licensing and enforce laws effectively.
