This is a professional services contract for the design and implementation of the 2022 Point In Time (PIT) Count. The scope of services for the 2022 PIT Count supports the mandated federal requirement by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for each Continuum of Care (CoC).

2. Provide a detailed description of services/commodities and how they will be used within the department. HUD requires that each CoC conduct a PIT Count of people experiencing unsheltered homelessness biennially. The PIT Count is conducted in accordance with HUD guidelines and is required to capture information about households' demographic information. HUD requires that the count be conducted during the last 10 days in January.

As the Administrative Entity for the Orange County CoC, Health Care Agency (HCA) has the responsibility to ensure that the PIT Count is conducted in accordance to the HUD guidelines. In 2015 and 2017, the County contracted with 211OC as the lead agency for the PIT count processes. An extrapolation method was used that estimated the number and characteristics of unsheltered homeless persons by utilizing a relatively small survey sample size. For the 2019 PIT Count, the County altered methodology and implemented a comprehensive 2019 count process which enhanced data collection. The 2019 PIT was an actual count that incorporated the use of technology, such as ArcGIS survey mapping, to help identify local "hot spots" (geographical areas where a large number of homeless individuals and families are located) and phone applications to capture demographics and information about the characteristics of unsheltered homeless individuals and families in Orange County. For the 2021 PIT, the Orange County CoC was planning on replicating the upgraded methodology and process of the 2019 PIT count; however due to COVID-19 pandemic HUD provided an exemption to forgo the unsheltered count in order to mitigate unnecessary exposure and spread of COVID-19 illness in the community.

For the 2022 PIT count process, HCA is seeking to replicate the upgraded methodology and process of the 2019 PIT count and leveraging the work done in preparation of the 2021 PIT that was not conducted. In light of the COVID-19 pandemic and the preventative and mitigating measures needed to limit the spread of COVID-19 in the community, HCA will be monitoring the potential effects on the methodology and process for the 2022 PIT count in consultation with the Public Health Officer. This includes taking into consideration the guidance released by the federal and state governments in regards to the COVID-19. Pandemic.

Kingdom Causes, Inc. dba City Net has extensive experience surveying people experiencing unsheltered homelessness. In addition to their work on the Flood Control Channel Engagement Initiative and the Santa Ana Civic Center, City Net has conducted 31 homeless counts from 2016 to 2022, including 18 in Orange County cities, conducted the North Orange County census that covered 12 cities in the North Service Planning Area and served as the PIT Count Project Lead in 2019 and 2021. City Net's unique professional experience meets the need for a successful design and implementation of the 2022 PIT Count. While in the past People for Irvine Community Health dba 2-1-1 Orange County was previously contracted to execute the PIT count process, the data extrapolation methods utilized and their need to contract with an outside consulting agency is not sufficient to meet the County's needs for accurate data compilation.

City Net plays a vital role in the County's efforts to engage individuals and families experiencing homelessness and to build a responsive and effective system of care. As a provider that conducts street outreach in many communities throughout Orange County, City Net is involved in the Orange County Continuum of Care Street Outreach Committee, collaborating and coordinating the street outreach response within Orange County while incorporating evidenced-based practices. Through this, City Net has developed unique knowledge and lasting partnerships they are able to leverage and count on during the planning process and execution of the 2022 PIT count. City Net is the only organization in Orange County that provides the unique technical expertise for the logistical planning, support and implementation that is required of the 2022 PIT Count for the Orange County CoC given their previous contracts with cities, communities and the County to conduct homeless counts. Through the implementation of numerous city-level and regional counts, City Net has been able to gain experience and expertise in the development of maps and hot spot locations through partnerships with law enforcements and other homeless service providers, as well as refining the logistical coordination and deployment of volunteers into the community for the canvasing and surveying of the homeless population.

The Orange County CoC, the County of Orange and cities will all benefit from the 2022 PIT Count design and implementation by City Net, especially as homeless service program funding has recently been allocated based on the number of people experiencing homelessness in the jurisdiction. The 2022 PIT information will provide vital information on demographics and subpopulations of those experiencing homelessness as well as needed information to complete the Consolidated Plan. City Net's unique experience and role in homeless services in Orange County, makes them the only organization that can successfully complete the required PIT count.

Based on the Scope of Services, the cost for services are in line with what other CoCs are paying for PIT Count Services. The Los Angeles Homeless Service Authority who oversees the implementation of the PIT Count in Los Angeles County pays approximately \$500,000 annually for the design and implementation of the Point In Time, not including expenses related to agency personnel.

Additionally, based on discussions with other Continuums of Care that participate in the Southern California Alliance of Continuums of Care, changes in methodology, implementation and related costs from previous PIT Count to the 2022 PIT Count are due to the increased preventative measures needed to limit the spread of COVID-19 in the community.

The County would not be able to implement a countywide homeless count per HUD's guidance given the short timeframe and the labor-intensive preparations and planning that needs to take place. HCA does not have the capacity to complete all the activities as detailed in the Scope of Services due to limited staff and the training and expertise required. This would jeopardize HUD funding that HCA currently has and future grant opportunities from the State
