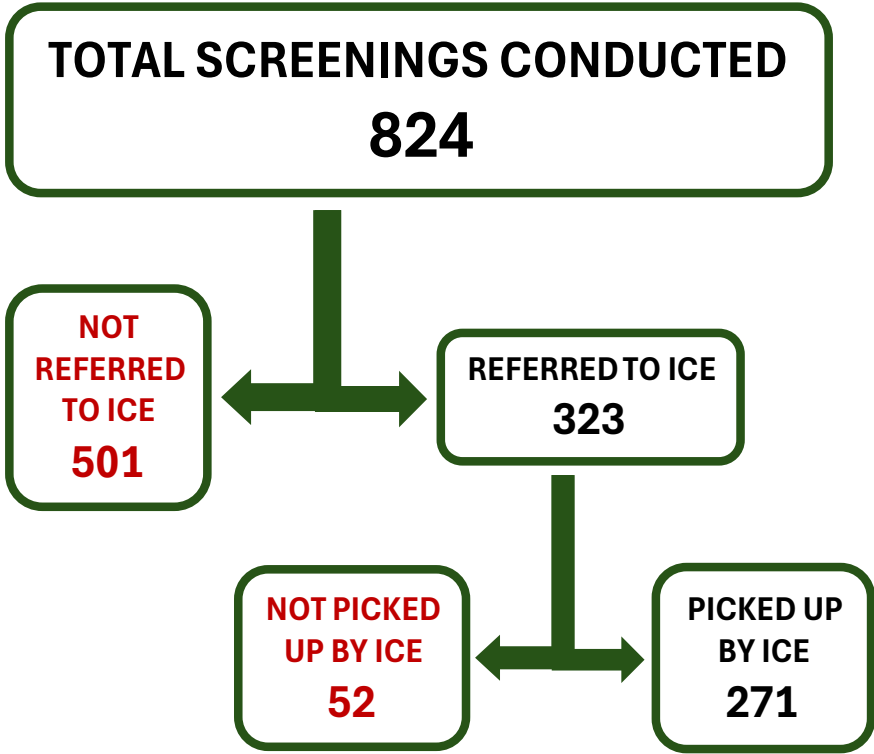
ICE Statistics - 2025 Calendar Year

For the calendar year of 2025, a total of 824 individual screenings were conducted for inmates released from the Orange County Jail who had a Hold, Transfer, Notification Request or who had a Judicial Probable Cause Determination or Judicial Warrant; meaning ICE had requested OCSD to notify them when these inmates were being released from local custody.

Of the 824 screenings, there were 323 instances where OCSD notified ICE upon the inmates' completion of their time in local custody, as allowed per *CA Senate Bill 54 "The California Values Act"*.

- 1. 271 of the 323 screenings resulted in the inmate being released to the custody of ICE
- 2. 42 of the 323 screenings resulted in the inmate not being picked up by ICE, these inmates were released back into the community. 10 of the 323 screenings had their detainers lifted by ICE after OCSD's screening.

Of the 824 screenings, there were 501 instances where state law prohibited OCSD from notifying ICE. This resulted in the inmate being released back into the community.

Of the 501 screenings that were not referred to ICE, 55 individuals committed new offenses in Orange County and were re-arrested 1 or more times.

- The types of crimes included, but not limited to; Assault with a deadly weapon (PC 245(a)(1)), Criminal threats (PC 422), Driving under the influence (VC 23152(a)), Drug violations (HS 11377(a), HS 11395(b)(1), HS 11364(a)), False imprisonment (PC 236), Grand theft (PC 487(a)), Concealed weapons (PC 21310), Theft (PC 484)

Of the 52 screenings that were referred to ICE but not picked up, 16 individuals committed new offenses in Orange County and were re-arrested 1 or more times.

- The types of crimes included, but not limited to; Burglary (PC 459), Assault with a deadly weapon (PC 245(a)(4)), Parole violations (PC 3455), Vandalism (PC 594(b)(1)), Restraining order violations (PC 166(c)(1)), Firearm violations (PC 30305(a)(1)), Domestic violence (PC 273.5(a))

Of the 271 screenings that were referred to ICE and picked up, 14 individuals committed new offenses in Orange County and were re-arrested 1 or more times.

- The types of crimes included, but not limited to; Drug violations (HS 11395(b)(1), HS 11377(a), HS 11350(a)), Parole violations (PC 3455), Resisting arrest (PC 148(a)(1)), Burglary (PC 459(a)), Theft (PC 459.5(a)), Vandalism (PC 594(b)(1))

There were 729 unique individuals who accounted for all 824 screenings. 644 individuals were screened once. The above 85 individuals accounted for the remaining 180 screenings.
