County of Orange Report on Grant Applications/Awards

The Grants Report is a condensed list of grant requests by County Agencies/Departments that allows the Board of Supervisors to discuss and approve grant submittals in one motion at a Board meeting. County policy dictates that the Board of Supervisors must approve all grant applications prior to submittal to the grantor. This applies to grants of all amounts, as well as to new grants and those that have been received by the County for many years as part of an ongoing grant. Receipt of grants under \$50,000 is delegated to the County Executive Officer. Grant awards greater than \$50,000 must be presented to the Board of Supervisors for receipt of funds. This report allows for better tracking of county grant requests, the success rate of our grants, and monitoring of County's grants activities. It also serves to inform Orange County's Sacramento and Washington, D.C. advocates of County grant activities involving the State or Federal Governments.

Grant Award Information	On October 3, 2013, SCAG informed the County that OC Public Works/OC Planning Services had been awarded a Sustainability Program grant valued at approximately \$200,000. This will be a one-time grant to complete an update to the County's Zoning Code. SCAG will manage the consultant selection process, award contract, manage the contract, and -make progress payments. OC Planning Services will manage the project and supervise the consultant work. The consultant selection process is expected to begin in February 2014 and the project will begin in June or July 2014. The project is expected to take approximately 12 months to complete.			
	This grant will be used to update and "green" the County's Zoning Code. The regulations and practices in the current version of the Zoning Code do not reflect sustainable practices or current best management practices (BMPs), nor do they allow for technological advances. For example, Stateissued water quality permits require the use of BMPs that facilitate infiltration on a site. However, not every type of commonly used infiltration BMP			

could be implemented on the site under current Zoning Code regulations. Applying the current Zoning Code requirements would make it difficult for an applicant to comply with this permit requirement. To address these inconsistencies, OC Planning is currently undergoing an update to its General Plan to incorporate watershed protection policies and is planning to do the same to the County's Zoning Code. Assistance from SCAG would allow OC Planning to update the entire Zoning Code to not only address water quality issues but also incorporate sustainable practices related to land use, public health, active transportation, energy efficiency, and conservation.

The Bicycle Corridor Improvement (BCI) Program is funded using federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) funds, first authorized under the Intermodal Surface Transportation Equity Act for the 21 st Century (TEA-21) in 1998, and the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: a Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) and extended through several continuing resolutions. The CMAQ program provides funding through annual appropriations to Orange County to be used for transportation-related projects that reduce congestion and improve air quality. The Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) is responsible for selecting regionally significant projects for Orange County and working with California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) which is administering selected projects. Projects eligible for CMAQ funding include bicycle facilities and bicycle safety/outreach projects. On August 13, 2012, OCTA's Board of Directors approved funding of up to \$1,000,000 in CMAQ funds, to be matched with \$521,000 in County funds, for the Coyote Creek Class I Bikeway project.
