15	CALIFORNIA, IRVINE and the, CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER: (CONTRACTOR). This
16	Agreement shall be administered by the County of Orange Health Care Agency (ADMINISTRATOR).

II. ALTERATION OF TERMS

- A. This Agreement, together with Exhibits A, B, and C attached hereto and incorporated herein, fully expresses the complete understanding of COUNTY and CONTRACTOR with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement.
- B. Unless otherwise expressly stated in this Agreement, no addition to, or alteration of the terms of this Agreement or any Exhibits, whether written or verbal, made by the parties, their officers, employees or agents shall be valid unless made in the form of a written amendment to this Agreement, which has been formally approved and executed by both parties.

III. ASSIGNMENT OF DEBTS

Unless this Agreement is followed without interruption by another Agreement between the parties hereto for the same services and substantially the same scope, at the termination of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall assign to COUNTY any debts owing to CONTRACTOR by or on behalf of persons receiving services pursuant to this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall immediately notify by mail each of these persons, specifying the date of assignment, the County of Orange as assignee, and the address to which payments are to be sent. Payments received by CONTRACTOR from or on behalf of said persons, shall be immediately given to COUNTY.

IV. <u>COMPLIANCE</u>

- A. ADMINISTRATOR has established a Compliance Program for the purpose of ensuring adherence to all rules and regulations related to federal and state health care programs.
- 1. ADMINISTRATOR shall provide CONTRACTOR with a copy of the relevant HCA policies and procedures relating to HCA's Compliance Program, HCA's Code of Conduct and General Compliance Trainings.
- 2. CONTRACTOR has the option to adhere to HCA's Compliance Program and Code of Conduct or establish its own, provided CONTRACTOR's Compliance Program and Code of Conduct have been verified to include all required elements by ADMINISTRATOR's Compliance Officer as described in subparagraphs below.
- 3. If CONTRACTOR elects to adhere to HCA's Compliance Program and Code of Conduct; the CONTRACTOR shall submit to the ADMINISTRATOR within thirty (30) calendar days of award of this Agreement a signed acknowledgement that CONTRACTOR shall comply with HCA's Compliance Program and Code of Conduct.
- 4. If CONTRACTOR elects to have its own Compliance Program and Code of Conduct then it shall submit a copy of its Compliance Program, Code of Conduct and relevant policies and procedures to ADMINISTRATOR within thirty (30) calendar days of award of this Agreement. ADMINISTRATOR's

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Compliance Officer shall determine if **CONTRACTOR** CONTRACTOR's Compliance Program and 1 Code of Conduct contains all required elements. CONTRACTOR shall take necessary action to meet 2 said standards or shall be asked to acknowledge and agree to the HCA's Compliance Program and Code 3 of Conduct if the CONTRACTOR's Compliance Program and Code of Conduct does not contain all 4 required elements. 5

- 5. Upon written confirmation from ADMINISTRATOR's Compliance Officer that the CONTRACTOR CONTRACTOR's Compliance Program and Code of Conduct contains all required elements, CONTRACTOR shall ensure that all Covered Individuals relative to this Agreement are made aware of CONTRACTOR's Compliance Program, Code of Conduct and related policies and procedures.
- 6. Failure of CONTRACTOR to submit its Compliance Program, Code of Conduct and relevant policies and procedures shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement. Failure to cure such breach within sixty (60) calendar days of such notice from ADMINISTRATOR shall constitute grounds for termination of this Agreement as to the non-complying party.
- B. SANCTION SCREENING CONTRACTOR shall adhere to all screening policies and procedures and screen all Covered Individuals employed or retained to provide services related to this Agreement to ensure that they are not designated as Ineligible Persons, as pursuant to this Agreement. Screening shall be conducted against the General Services Administration's Excluded Parties List System or System for Award Management, the Health and Human Services/Office of Inspector General List of Excluded Individuals/Entities, and the California Medi-Cal Suspended and Ineligible Provider List and/or any other <u>list or system</u> as identified by the ADMINISTRATOR.
- 1. Covered Individuals includes all contractors, subcontractors, agents, and other persons who provide health care items or services or who perform billing or coding functions on behalf of ADMINISTRATOR. Notwithstanding the above, this term does not include part-time or per-diem employees, contractors, subcontractors, agents, and other persons who are not reasonably expected to work more than one hundred sixty (160) hours per year; except that any such individuals shall become Covered Individuals at the point when they work more than one hundred sixty (160) hours during the calendar year. CONTRACTOR shall ensure that all Covered Individuals relative to this Agreement are made aware of ADMINISTRATOR's Compliance Program, Code of Conduct and related policies and procedures.
 - 2. An Ineligible Person shall be any individual or entity who:
- a. is currently excluded, suspended, debarred or otherwise ineligible to participate in federal and state health care programs; or
- b. has been convicted of a criminal offense related to the provision of health care items or services and has not been reinstated in the federal and state health care programs after a period of exclusion, suspension, debarment, or ineligibility.
- 3. CONTRACTOR shall screen prospective Covered Individuals prior to hire or engagement. CONTRACTOR shall not hire or engage any Ineligible Person to provide services relative to this

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- 4. CONTRACTOR shall screen all current Covered Individuals and subcontractors semiannually to ensure that they have not become Ineligible Persons. CONTRACTOR shall also request that its subcontractors use their best efforts to verify that they are eligible to participate in all federal and State of California health programs and have not been excluded or debarred from participation in any federal or state health care programs, and to further represent to CONTRACTOR that they do not have any Ineligible Person in their employ or under contract.
- 5. Covered Individuals shall be required to disclose to CONTRACTOR immediately any debarment, exclusion or other event that makes the Covered Individual an Ineligible Person. CONTRACTOR shall notify ADMINISTRATOR immediately if a Covered Individual providing services directly relative to this Agreement becomes debarred, excluded or otherwise becomes an Ineligible Person.
- 6. CONTRACTOR acknowledges that Ineligible Persons are precluded from providing federal and state funded health care services by contract with COUNTY in the event that they are currently sanctioned or excluded by a federal or state law enforcement regulatory or licensing agency. If CONTRACTOR becomes aware that a Covered Individual has become an Ineligible Person, CONTRACTOR shall remove such individual from responsibility for, or involvement with, COUNTY business operations related to this Agreement.
- 7. CONTRACTOR shall notify ADMINISTRATOR immediately if a Covered Individual or entity is currently excluded, suspended or debarred, or is identified as such after being sanction screened. Such individual or entity shall be immediately removed from participating in any activity associated with this Agreement. ADMINISTRATOR will determine appropriate repayment from, or sanction(s) to CONTRACTOR for services provided by ineligible person or individual. CONTRACTOR shall promptly return any overpayments within forty-five (45) business days after the overpayment is verified by the ADMINISTRATOR.
- C. COMPLIANCE TRAINING ADMINISTRATOR shall make General Compliance Training and Provider Compliance Training, where appropriate, available to Covered Individuals.
- 1. CONTRACTOR shall use its best efforts to encourage completion by Covered Individuals; provided, however, that at a minimum CONTRACTOR shall assign at least one (1) designated representative to complete all Compliance Trainings when offered.
- 2. Such training will be made available to Covered Individuals within thirty (30) calendar days of employment or engagement.
 - 3. Such training will be made available to each Covered Individual annually.
- 4. Each Covered Individual attending training shall certify, in writing, attendance at compliance training. CONTRACTOR shall retain the certifications. Upon written request by ADMINISTRATOR, CONTRACTOR shall provide copies of the certifications.

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V. CONFIDENTIALITY

- A. CONTRACTOR shall maintain the confidentiality of all records, including billings and any audio and/or video recordings, in accordance with all applicable federal, state and county codes and regulations, as they now exist or may hereafter be amended or changed.
- 1. CONTRACTOR acknowledges and agrees that all persons served pursuant to this Agreement are participants of the Orange County Mental Health services system, and therefore it may be necessary for authorized staff of ADMINISTRATOR to audit participant files, or to exchange information regarding specific participants with COUNTY or other providers of related services contracting with COUNTY.
- 2. CONTRACTOR acknowledges and agrees that it shall be responsible for obtaining written consents for the release of information from all persons served by CONTRACTOR pursuant to this Agreement. Such consents shall be obtained by CONTRACTOR in accordance with CCC, Division 1, Part 2.6, relating to confidentiality of medical information.
- 3. In the event of a collaborative service agreement between Mental Health services providers, CONTRACTOR acknowledges and agrees that it is responsible for obtaining releases of information, from the collaborative agency, for participants receiving services through the collaborative agreement.
- B. Prior to providing any services pursuant to this Agreement, all members of the Board of Directors or its designee or authorized agent, employees, consultants, subcontractors, volunteers and interns of the CONTRACTOR shall agree, in writing, with CONTRACTOR to maintain the confidentiality of any and all information and records which may be obtained in the course of providing such services. This Agreement shall specify that it is effective irrespective of all subsequent resignations or terminations of CONTRACTOR members of the Board of Directors or its designee or authorized agent, employees, consultants, subcontractors, volunteers and interns.
- C. If CONTRACTOR is a public institution, COUNTY understands and agrees the CONTRACTOR is subject to the provisions of the California Public Records Act. In the event CONTRACTOR receives a request to produce this Agreement, or identify any term, condition, or aspect of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall notify COUNTY no less than three (3) business days prior to releasing such information.

VI. COST REPORT

A. CONTRACTOR shall submit separate Cost Reports for Period One and Period Two, or for a portion thereof, to COUNTY no later than sixty (60) calendar days following the period for which they are prepared or termination of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall prepare the individual and/or consolidated Cost Report in accordance with all applicable federal, state and COUNTY requirements, GAAP and the Special Provisions Paragraph of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall allocate direct and indirect costs to and between programs, cost centers, services, and funding sources in accordance with such requirements and consistent with prudent business practice, which costs and allocations shall

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be supported by source documentation maintained by CONTRACTOR, and available at any time to ADMINISTRATOR upon reasonable notice. In the event CONTRACTOR has multiple Agreements for mental health services that are administered by HCA, consolidation of the individual Cost Reports into a single consolidated Cost Report may be required, as stipulated by ADMINISTRATOR. CONTRACTOR shall submit a consolidated Cost Report to COUNTY no later than five (5) business days following approval by ADMINISTRATOR of all individual Cost Reports to be incorporated into a consolidated Cost Report.

- 1. If CONTRACTOR fails to submit an accurate and complete individual and/or consolidated Cost Report within the time period specified above, ADMINISTRATOR shall have sole discretion to impose one or both of the following:
- a. CONTRACTOR may be assessed a late penalty of five hundred dollars (\$500) for each business day after the above specified due date that the accurate and complete individual and/or consolidated Cost Report is not submitted. Imposition of the late penalty shall be at the sole discretion of the ADMINISTRATOR. The late penalty shall be assessed separately on each outstanding individual and/or consolidated Cost Report due COUNTY by CONTRACTOR.
- b. ADMINISTRATOR may withhold or delay any or all payments due CONTRACTOR pursuant to any or all agreements between COUNTY and CONTRACTOR until such time that the accurate and complete individual and/or consolidated Cost Report is delivered to ADMINISTRATOR.
- 2. CONTRACTOR may request, in advance and in writing, an extension of the due date of the individual and/or consolidated Cost Report setting forth good cause for justification of the request. Approval of such requests shall be at the sole discretion of ADMINISTRATOR and shall not be unreasonably denied.
- 3. In the event that CONTRACTOR does not submit an accurate and complete individual and/or consolidated Cost Report within one hundred and eighty (180) calendar days following the termination of this Agreement, and CONTRACTOR has not entered into a subsequent or new agreement for any other services with COUNTY, then all amounts paid to CONTRACTOR by COUNTY during the term of the Agreement shall be immediately reimbursed to COUNTY.
- B. The individual and/or consolidated Cost Report <u>prepared for each period</u> shall be the final financial and statistical report submitted by CONTRACTOR to COUNTY, and shall serve as the basis for final settlement to CONTRACTOR. <u>for that period</u>. CONTRACTOR shall document that costs are reasonable and allowable and directly or indirectly related to the services to be provided hereunder. The individual and/or consolidated Cost Report shall be the final financial record for subsequent audits, if any.
- C. Final settlement shall be based upon the actual and reimbursable costs for services hereunder, less applicable revenues and any late penalty, not to exceed COUNTY's Maximum Obligation as set forth in the Referenced Contract Provisions of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall not claim expenditures to COUNTY which are not reimbursable pursuant to applicable federal, state and

COUNTY laws, regulations and requirements. Any payment made by COUNTY to CONTRACTOR, which is subsequently determined to have been for an unreimbursable expenditure or service, shall be repaid by CONTRACTOR to COUNTY in cash, or other authorized form of payment, within thirty (30) calendar days of submission of the individual and/or consolidated Cost Report or COUNTY may elect to reduce any amount owed CONTRACTOR by an amount not to exceed the reimbursement due COUNTY.

- D. If the individual and/or consolidated Cost Report indicates the actual and reimbursable costs of services provided pursuant to this Agreement, less applicable revenues and late penalty, are lower than the aggregate of interim monthly payments to CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR shall remit the difference to COUNTY. Such reimbursement shall be made, in cash, or other authorized form of payment, with the submission of the individual and/or consolidated Cost Report. If such reimbursement is not made by CONTRACTOR within thirty (30) calendar days after submission of the individual and/or consolidated Cost Report, COUNTY may, in addition to any other remedies, reduce any amount owed CONTRACTOR by an amount not to exceed the reimbursement due COUNTY.
- E. If the individual and/or consolidated Cost Report indicates the actual and reimbursable costs of services provided pursuant to this Agreement, less applicable revenues and late penalty, are higher than the aggregate of interim monthly payments to CONTRACTOR, COUNTY shall pay CONTRACTOR the difference, provided such payment does not exceed the Maximum Obligation of COUNTY.
- F. All individual and/or consolidated All Cost Reports shall contain the following attestation, which may be typed directly on or attached to the Cost Report:

VII. DELEGATION, ASSIGNMENT AND SUBCONTRACTS

- A. CONTRACTOR may not delegate the obligations hereunder, either in whole or in part, without prior written consent of COUNTY. CONTRACTOR shall provide written notification of CONTRACTOR's intent to delegate the obligations hereunder, either in whole or part, to ADMINISTRATOR not less than sixty (60) calendar days prior to the effective date of the delegation. Any attempted assignment or delegation in derogation of this paragraph shall be void.
- B. CONTRACTOR may not assign the rights hereunder, either in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of COUNTY.
- 1. If CONTRACTOR is a nonprofit organization, any change from a nonprofit corporation to any other corporate structure of CONTRACTOR, including a change in more than fifty percent (50%) of the composition of the Board of Directors within a two (2) month period of time, shall be deemed an assignment for purposes of this paragraph, unless CONTRACTOR is transitioning from a community clinic/health center to a Federally Qualified Health Center and has been so designated by the Federal Government. Any attempted assignment or delegation in derogation of this subparagraph shall be void.
- 2. If CONTRACTOR is a for-profit organization, any change in the business structure, including but not limited to, the sale or transfer of more than ten percent (10%) of the assets or stocks of CONTRACTOR, change to another corporate structure, including a change to a sole proprietorship, or a change in fifty percent (50%) or more of Board of Directors or any governing body of CONTRACTOR at one time shall be deemed an assignment pursuant to this paragraph. Any attempted assignment or delegation in derogation of this subparagraph shall be void.
- 3. If CONTRACTOR is a governmental organization, any change to another structure, including a change in more than fifty percent (50%) of the composition of its governing body (i.e. Board of Supervisors, City Council, School Board) within a two (2) month period of time, shall be deemed an assignment for purposes of this paragraph. Any attempted assignment or delegation in derogation of this subparagraph shall be void.
- 4. Whether CONTRACTOR is a nonprofit, for-profit, or a governmental organization, CONTRACTOR shall provide written notification of CONTRACTOR's intent to assign the obligations hereunder, either in whole or part, to ADMINISTRATOR not less than sixty (60) calendar days prior to the effective date of the assignment.
- 5. Whether CONTRACTOR is a nonprofit, for-profit, or a governmental organization, CONTRACTOR shall provide written notification within thirty (30) calendar days to ADMINISTRATOR when there is change of less than fifty percent (50%) of Board of Directors or any governing body of CONTRACTOR at one time.
- C. CONTRACTOR's obligations undertaken pursuant to this Agreement may be carried out by means of subcontracts, provided such subcontracts are approved in advance, in writing by ADMINISTRATOR, meet the requirements of this Agreement as they relate to the service or activity under subcontract, and include any provisions that ADMINISTRATOR may require.

- 1. After approval of a subcontract, ADMINISTRATOR may revoke the approval of a subcontract upon five (5) calendar daysdays' written notice to CONTRACTOR if the subcontract subsequently fails to meet the requirements of this Agreement or any provisions that ADMINISTRATOR has required.
- 2. No subcontract shall terminate or alter the responsibilities of CONTRACTOR to COUNTY pursuant to this Agreement.
- 3. ADMINISTRATOR may disallow, from payments otherwise due CONTRACTOR, amounts claimed for subcontracts not approved in accordance with this paragraph.
- 4. This provision shall not be applicable to service agreements usually and customarily entered into by CONTRACTOR to obtain or arrange for supplies, technical support, and professional services provided by consultants.

VIII. EMPLOYEE ELIGIBILITY VERIFICATION

CONTRACTOR attests warrants that it shall fully comply with all federal and state statutes and regulations regarding the employment of aliens and others and to ensure that employees, subcontractors, and consultants performing work under this Agreement meet the citizenship or alien status requirement set forth in federal statutes and regulations. CONTRACTOR shall obtain, from all employees, subcontractors, and consultants performing work hereunder, all verification and other documentation of employment eligibility status required by federal or state statutes and regulations including, but not limited to, the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, 8 USC §1324 et seq., as they currently exist and as they may be hereafter amended. CONTRACTOR shall retain all such documentation for all covered employees, subcontractors, and consultants for the period prescribed by the law.

IX. EQUIPMENT

- A. Unless otherwise specified in writing by ADMINISTRATOR, Equipment is defined as all property of a Relatively Permanent nature with significant value, purchased in whole or in part by ADMINISTRATOR to assist in performing the services described in this Agreement. "Relatively Permanent" is defined as having a useful life of one year or longer. Equipment which costs \$5,000 or over, including freight charges, sales taxes, and other taxes, and installation costs are defined as Capital Assets. Equipment which costs between \$600 and \$5,000, including freight charges, sales taxes and other taxes, and installation costs, or electronic equipment that costs less than \$600 but may contained PHI or PII, are defined as Controlled Equipment. Controlled Equipment includes, but is not limited to phones, tablets, audio/visual equipment, computer equipment, and lab equipment. The cost of Equipment purchased, in whole or in part, with funds paid pursuant to this Agreement shall be depreciated according to GAAP.
- B. CONTRACTOR shall obtain ADMINISTRATOR's prior written approval to purchase any Equipment with funds paid pursuant to this Agreement. Upon delivery of Equipment, CONTRACTOR

- C. Upon ADMINISTRATOR's prior written approval, CONTRACTOR may expense to COUNTY the cost of the approved Equipment purchased by CONTRACTOR. To "expense," in relation to Equipment, means to charge the proportionate cost of Equipment in the fiscal year in which it is purchased. Title of expensed Equipment shall be vested with COUNTY.
- D. CONTRACTOR shall maintain an inventory of all Equipment purchased in whole or in part with funds paid through this Agreement, including date of purchase, purchase price, serial number, model and type of Equipment. Such inventory shall be available for review by ADMINISTRATOR, and shall include the original purchase date and price, useful life, and balance of depreciated Equipment cost, if any.
- E. CONTRACTOR shall cooperate with ADMINISTRATOR in conducting periodic physical inventories of all Equipment. Upon demand by ADMINISTRATOR, CONTRACTOR shall return any or all Equipment to COUNTY.
- F. CONTRACTOR must report any loss or theft of Equipment in accordance with the procedure approved by ADMINISTRATOR and the Notices Paragraph of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR must complete and submit to ADMINISTRATOR a notification form when items of Equipment are moved from one location to another or returned to COUNTY as surplus.
- G. Unless this Agreement is followed without interruption by another agreement between the parties for substantially the same type and scope of services, at the termination of this Agreement for any cause, CONTRACTOR shall return to COUNTY all Equipment purchased with funds paid through this Agreement.
- H. CONTRACTOR shall maintain and administer a sound business program for ensuring the proper use, maintenance, repair, protection, insurance, and preservation of COUNTY Equipment.

X. EXPENDITURE AND REVENUE REPORT

- A. No later than sixty (60) calendar days following termination of each period or fiscal year of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall submit to ADMINISTRATOR, for informational purposes only, an Expenditure Report for the preceding fiscal year, or portion thereof. Such report shall be prepared in accordance with the procedure that is provided by ADMINISTRATOR and GAAP.
- B. CONTRACTOR may be required to submit periodic Expenditure Reports throughout the term of this Agreement.
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XI. FACILITIES, PAYMENTS AND SERVICES

CONTRACTOR agrees to provide the services, staffing, facilities, and supplies in accordance with Exhibit A to this Agreement. COUNTY shall compensate, and authorize, when applicable, said services. CONTRACTOR shall operate continuously throughout the term of this Agreement with at least the minimum number and type of staff which meet applicable federal and state requirements, and which are necessary for the provision of the services hereunder.

XI. INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE

A. CONTRACTOR agrees to indemnify, defend with counsel approved in writing by COUNTY, and hold COUNTY, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees, agents and those special districts and agencies for which COUNTY's COUNTY's Board of Supervisors acts as the governing Board (COUNTY INDEMNITEES) harmless from any claims, demands or liability of any kind or nature, including but not limited to personal, loss, expense, attorneys' fees or claims for injury or property damage, damages arising from or related to the services, products or other out of the performance provided by CONTRACTOR pursuant to of this Agreement. but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees or claims for injury or damages are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of CONTRACTOR, its officers, employees or agents. If judgment is entered against CONTRACTOR and COUNTY by a court of competent jurisdiction because of the concurrent active negligence of COUNTY or COUNTY INDEMNITEES, CONTRACTOR and COUNTY agree that liability will be apportioned as determined by the court. Neither party shall request a jury apportionment.

- B. Prior to the provision of services under this Agreement Without limiting CONTRACTOR's indemnification, CONTRACTOR agrees to purchase all required insurance at CONTRACTOR's expense and to submit to COUNTY the COI, including all endorsements required herein, necessary to satisfy COUNTY attests that the insurance provisions of this Agreement have been complied with and to it is self-insured or shall maintain such insurance coverage with COUNTY in force at all times during the entire term of this Agreement, the policy or policies of insurance covering its operations placed with reputable insurance companies in amounts as specified in the Referenced Contract Provisions of this Agreement. In addition, Upon request by ADMINISTRATOR, CONTRACTOR shall provide evidence of such insurance.
- C. COUNTY warrants that it is self-insured or maintains policies of insurance placed with reputable insurance companies licensed to do business in the State of California which insures the perils of bodily injury, medical, professional liability, and property damage. Upon request by CONTRACTOR, COUNTY shall provide evidence of such insurance.
- D. CONTRACTOR shall ensure that all subcontractors performing work on behalf of CONTRACTOR pursuant to this Agreement shall obtain be covered under CONTRACTOR's insurance as an Additional Insured or maintain insurance subject to the same terms and conditions as set forth

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herein for CONTRACTOR. <u>CONTRACTOR shall not allow subcontractors to work if subcontractors have less than the level of coverage required by COUNTY from CONTRACTOR under this Agreement.</u>

It is the obligation of CONTRACTOR to provide notice of the insurance requirements to every subcontractor and to receive proof of insurance prior to allowing any subcontractor to begin work. Such proof of insurance must be maintained by CONTRACTOR through the entirety of this Agreement for inspection by COUNTY representative(s) at any reasonable time.

All SIRs and deductibles shall be clearly stated on the COI. If no SIRs or deductibles apply, indicate this on the COI with a zero (0) by the appropriate line of coverage. Any SIR or deductible in an amount in excess of \$25,000 (\$5,000 for automobile liability), shall specifically be approved by the CEO/Office of Risk Management upon review of CONTRACTOR's current audited financial report.

<u>DF</u>. If <u>CONTRATOR CONTRACTOR</u> fails to maintain insurance acceptable to COUNTY for the full term of this Agreement, COUNTY may terminate this Agreement.

G. QUALIFIED INSURER

Such persons may at all reasonable times inspect or otherwise evaluate the services provided pursuant to this Agreement, and the premises in which they are provided.
- B. CONTRACTOR shall actively participate and cooperate with any person specified in Subparagraph A. above in any Evaluation or monitoring of the services provided pursuant to this Agreement, and shall provide the above–mentioned persons adequate office space to conduct such Evaluation or monitoring.
- C. COUNTY shall provide CONTRACTOR with at least seventy-two (72) hours' notice of such inspections or Evaluations. Unannounced inspections, Evaluations, or requests for information may be made in those situations where arrangement of an appointment beforehand is not possible or is inappropriate due to the nature of the inspection or Evaluation.
- C. CONTRACTOR shall not be subject to disallowances as the result of audits of the cost of services.
- D. CONTRACTOR shall forward to ADMINISTRATOR a copy of any audit report within fourteen (14) calendar days of receipt. Such audit shall include, but not be limited to, management, financial, programmatic or any other type of audit of CONTRACTOR's operations, whether or not the cost of such operation or audit is reimbursed in whole or in part through this Agreement.
- E. COUNTY shall provide CONTRACTOR with at least seventy-two (72) hours' notice of such inspections or evaluations. Unannounced inspections, evaluations, or requests for information may be made in those situations where arrangement of an appointment beforehand is not possible or is inappropriate due to the nature of the inspection or evaluation.

XIII. <u>LICENSES AND LAWS</u>

A. CONTRACTOR, its officers, agents, employees, affiliates, and subcontractors shall, throughout the term of this Agreement, maintain all necessary licenses, permits, approvals, certificates, accreditations, waivers, and exemptions necessary for the provision of the services hereunder and required by the laws, regulations and requirements of the United States, the State of California,

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COUNTY, and all other applicable governmental agencies. CONTRACTOR shall notify ADMINISTRATOR immediately and in writing of its inability to obtain or maintain, irrespective of the pendency of any hearings or appeals, permits, licenses, approvals, certificates, accreditations, waivers and exemptions. Said inability shall be cause for termination of this Agreement.

B. ENFORCEMENT OF CHILD SUPPORT OBLIGATIONS

- 1. CONTRACTOR agrees to furnish to ADMINISTRATOR within thirty (30) calendar days of the award of this Agreement:
- a. In the case of an individual contractor, his/her name, date of birth, social security number, and residence address;
- b. In the case of a contractor doing business in a form other than as an individual, the name, date of birth, social security number, and residence address of each individual who owns an interest of ten percent (10%) or more in the contracting entity;
- c. A certification that CONTRACTOR has fully complied with all applicable federal and state reporting requirements regarding its employees;
- d. A certification that CONTRACTOR has fully complied with all lawfully served Wage and Earnings Assignment Orders and Notices of Assignment, and will continue to so comply.
- 2. Failure of CONTRACTOR to timely submit the data and/or certifications required by Subparagraphs 1.a., 1.b., 1.c., or 1.d. above, or to comply with all federal and state employee reporting requirements for child support enforcement, or to comply with all lawfully served Wage and Earnings Assignment Orders and Notices of Assignment, shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement; and failure to cure such breach within sixty (60) calendar days of notice from COUNTY shall constitute grounds for termination of this Agreement.
- 3. It is expressly understood that this data will be transmitted to governmental agencies charged with the establishment and enforcement of child support orders, or as permitted by federal and/or state statute.
- C. CONTRACTOR shall comply with all applicable governmental laws, regulations, and requirements as they exist now or may be hereafter amended or changed.
- D. CONTRACTOR attests that all CONTRACTOR physicians providing services under this Agreement are and will continue to be as long as this Agreement remains in effect, the holders of currently valid licenses to practice medicine in the State of California and are members in good standing of the medical staff of CONTRACTOR's facility.

XIV. <u>LITERATURE, ADVERTISEMENTS AND SOCIAL MEDIA</u> . LITERATURE, ADVERTISEMENTS, AND SOCIAL MEDIA

A. Any written information or literature, including educational or promotional materials, distributed by CONTRACTOR to any person or organization for purposes directly or indirectly related to this Agreement must be approved at least thirty (30) days in advance and in writing by

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ADMINISTRATOR before distribution. For the purposes of this Agreement, distribution of written materials shall include, but not be limited to, pamphlets, brochures, flyers, newspaper or magazine ads, and electronic media such as the Internet.

- B. Any advertisement through radio, television broadcast, or the Internet, for educational or promotional purposes, made by CONTRACTOR for purposes directly or indirectly related to this Agreement must be approved in advance at least thirty (30) days and in writing by ADMINISTRATOR.
- C. If CONTRACTOR uses social media (such as Facebook, Twitter, YouTube or other publicly available social media sites) in support of the services described within this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall develop social media policies policy and procedures and have them available to ADMINISTRATOR upon reasonable notice. CONTRACTOR shall inform ADMINISTRATOR of all forms of social media used to either directly or indirectly support the services described within this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall comply with COUNTY Social Media Use Policy and Procedures as they pertain to any social media developed in support of the services described within this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall also include any required funding statement information on social media when required by ADMINISTRATOR.
- D. Any information as described in Subparagraphs A. and B. above shall not imply endorsement by COUNTY, unless ADMINISTRATOR consents thereto in writing.
- E. Both parties agree that they will not use the name(s), symbols, trademarks or service marks, presently existing or later established, of the other party nor its employees in any advertisement, press release or publicity with reference to this Agreement without the prior written approval of the other party's authorized official. Requests for approval shall be made to ADMINISTRATOR or to CONTRACTOR's signatory of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR may represent itself as a contracted provider of the services described in this Agreement for the residents of Orange County as provided in Subparagraph A above. ADMINISTRATOR may include references to the services described in this Agreement in informational materials relating to the continuum of care provided using federal, state and county funds.

XV. XVI. MAXIMUM OBLIGATION

A. The Total Maximum Obligations Obligation of COUNTY for services provided in accordance with this Agreement, and the separate Maximum Obligations for Period One and Period Two each period under this Agreement, are as specified in the Referenced Contract Provisions of this Agreement, except as allowed for in Subparagraph B. below.

XVII. B. ADMINISTRATOR may amend the Maximum Obligation by an amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) of Period One funding for this Agreement.

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XVI. NONDISCRIMINATION

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A. EMPLOYMENT

- 1. During the term of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR and its Covered Individuals shall not unlawfully discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of his/her ethnic group identification, race, religion, ancestry, religious creed, color, ereed, sex, marital status, national origin, age (40 and over), sexual orientation, medical condition, or ancestry, physical ordisability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, sexual orientation, or military and veteran status. Additionally, during the term of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR and its Covered Individuals shall require in its subcontracts that subcontractors shall not unlawfully discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of his/her ethnic group identification, race, religion, ancestry, religious creed, color, ereed, sex, marital status, national origin, age (40 and over), sexual orientation, medical condition, or ancestry, physical ordisability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, sexual orientation, or military and veteran status.
- 2. CONTRACTOR and its Covered Individuals shall not discriminate against employees or applicants for employment in the areas of employment, promotion, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rate of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship.
- 3. CONTRACTOR shall not discriminate between employees with spouses and employees with domestic partners, or discriminate between domestic partners and spouses of those employees, in the provision of benefits.
- 4. CONTRACTOR shall post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices from ADMINISTRATOR and/or the United States Equal Employment Opportunity Commission setting forth the provisions of the Equal Opportunity clause.
- 5. All solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of CONTRACTOR and/or subcontractor shall state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to ethnic group identification, race, religion, ancestry, religious creed, color, ereed, sex, marital status, national origin, age (40 and over), sexual orientation, medical condition, or ancestry, physical ordisability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, sexual orientation, or military and veteran status. For the purpose of this Nondiscrimination paragraph, Discrimination includes, but is not 12 limited to the following based on one or more of the factors identified above: 13 14 accommodation. 15

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- 1. Denying a elient participant or potential elient participant any service, benefit, or
- 2. Providing any service or benefit to a elient participant which is different or is provided in a different manner or at a different time from that provided to other elients participants.
- 3. Restricting a elient participant in any way in the enjoyment of any advantage or privilege enjoyed by others receiving any service or benefit.

- C. COMPLAINT PROCESS CONTRACTOR shall establish procedures for advising all elients participants through a written statement that CONTRACTOR CONTRACTOR's and/or subcontractor's elients participants may file all complaints alleging discrimination in the delivery of services with CONTRACTOR, subcontractor, and ADMINISTRATOR or COUNTY's Patient's Patient Rights Office.
- 1. Whenever possible, problems shall be resolved informally and at the point of service. - b. Throughout the problem resolution and grievance process, elient participant rights shall be maintained, including access to the Patients' Rights Office at any point in the process. Clients Participants shall be informed of their right to access the Patients' Rights Office at any time.

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- 2. Within the time limits procedurally imposed, the complainant shall be notified in writing as to the findings regarding the alleged complaint and, if not satisfied with the decision, may file an appeal.
- D. PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES CONTRACTOR and/or subcontractor agree to comply with the provisions of §504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, (29 USC 794 et seq., as implemented in 45 CFR 84.1 et seq.), and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 USC 12101 et seq.), as applicable, pertaining to the prohibition of discrimination against qualified persons with disabilities in all programs or activities; and if applicable, as implemented in Title 45, CFR, §84.1 et seq., as they exist now or may be hereafter amended together with succeeding legislation.
- E. RETALIATION Neither CONTRACTOR nor subcontractor, nor its employees or agents shall intimidate, coerce or take adverse action against any person for the purpose of interfering with rights secured by federal or state laws, or because such person has filed a complaint, certified, assisted or otherwise participated in an investigation, proceeding, hearing or any other activity undertaken to enforce rights secured by federal or state law.
- F. In the event of non-compliance with this paragraph or as otherwise provided by federal and state law, this Agreement may be canceled, terminated or suspended in whole or in part and CONTRACTOR or subcontractor may be declared ineligible for further contracts involving federal, state or county funds.

XVII. NOTICES

- A. Unless otherwise specified, all notices, claims, correspondence, reports and/or statements authorized or required by this Agreement shall be effective:
- 1. When written and deposited in the United States mail, first class postage prepaid and addressed as specified in the Referenced Contract Provisions of this Agreement or as otherwise directed by ADMINISTRATOR:
 - 2. When faxed, transmission confirmed;
 - 3. When sent by Email; or
- 4. When accepted by U.S. Postal Service Express Mail, Federal Express, United Parcel Service, or other expedited delivery service.
- B. Termination Notices shall be addressed as specified in the Referenced Contract Provisions of this Agreement or as otherwise directed by ADMINISTRATOR and shall be effective when faxed, transmission confirmed, or when accepted by U.S. Postal Service Express Mail, Federal Express, United Parcel Service, or other expedited delivery service.
- C. CONTRACTOR shall notify ADMINISTRATOR, in writing, within twenty-four (24) hours of becoming aware of any occurrence of a serious nature, which may expose COUNTY to liability. Such occurrences shall include, but not be limited to, accidents, injuries, or acts of negligence, or loss or damage to any COUNTY property in possession of CONTRACTOR.
 - D. For purposes of this Agreement, any notice to be provided by COUNTY may be given by

ADMINISTRATOR.

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XVIII. NOTIFICATION OF DEATH NOTIFICATION OF DEATH

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A. Upon becoming aware of the death of any person served pursuant to this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall immediately notify ADMINISTRATOR.

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B. All Notifications of Death provided to ADMINISTRATOR by CONTRACTOR shall contain the name of the deceased, the date and time of death, the nature and circumstances of the death, and the name(s) of CONTRACTOR's officers or employees with knowledge of the incident.

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1. TELEPHONE NOTIFICATION – CONTRACTOR shall notify ADMINISTRATOR by telephone immediately upon becoming aware of the death due to non-terminal illness of any person served pursuant to this Agreement; provided, however, weekends and holidays shall not be included for purposes of computing the time within which to give telephone notice and, notwithstanding the time limit herein specified, notice need only be given during normal business hours.

2. WRITTEN NOTIFICATION

- a. NON-TERMINAL ILLNESS CONTRACTOR shall hand deliver, fax, and/or send via encrypted email to ADMINISTRATOR a written report within sixteen (16) hours after becoming aware of the death due to non-terminal illness of any person served pursuant to this Agreement.
- b. TERMINAL ILLNESS CONTRACTOR shall notify ADMINISTRATOR by written report hand delivered, faxed, sent via encrypted email, and/or postmarked and sent via U.S. Mail within forty-eight (48) hours of becoming aware of the death due to terminal illness of any person served pursuant to this Agreement.
- C. If there are any questions regarding the cause of death of any person served pursuant to this Agreement who was diagnosed with a terminal illness, or if there are any unusual circumstances related to the death, CONTRACTOR shall immediately notify ADMINISTRATOR in accordance with this Notification of Death Paragraph.

XIX. NOTIFICATION OF PUBLIC EVENTS AND MEETINGS. NOTIFICATION OF PUBLIC EVENTS AND MEETINGS

- A. CONTRACTOR shall notify ADMINISTRATOR of any public event or meeting funded in whole or part by the COUNTY, except for those events or meetings that are intended solely to serve elients participants or occur in the normal course of business.
- B. CONTRACTOR shall notify ADMINISTRATOR at least thirty (30) business days in advance of any applicable public event or meeting. The notification must include the date, time, duration, location and purpose of public event or meeting. Any promotional materials or event related flyers must be approved by ADMINISTRATOR prior to distribution.

1	XX. RECORDS MANAGEMENT AND MAINTENANCE
2	A. CONTRACTOR, its officers, agents, employees and subcontractors shall, throughout the term
3	of this Agreement, prepare, maintain and manage records appropriate to the services provided and in

27	accordance with the terms of this Agreement and common business practices. If documentation is
28	retained electronically, CONTRACTOR shall, in the event of an audit or site visit:
29	1. Have documents readily available within forty-eight (48) hour notice of a scheduled audit or

- H. CONTRACTOR shall retain all participant, client, and/or patient medical records for seven (7) years following discharge of the participant, client and/or patient, with the exception of non-emancipated minors for whom records must be kept for at all times least one (1) year after such minors have reached the age of eighteen (18) years, or for seven (7) years after the last date of service, whichever is longer.
- DI. CONTRACTOR shall retain all financial records for a minimum of seven (7) years from the commencement of the contract, unless a longer period is required due to legal proceedings such as litigations and/or settlement of claims.
- EI. CONTRACTOR shall make records pertaining to the costs of services, participant fees, charges, billings, and revenues available at one (1) location within the limits of the County of Orange.
- FK. If CONTRACTOR is unable to meet the record location criteria above, ADMINISTRATOR may provide written approval to CONTRACTOR to maintain records in a single location, identified by CONTRACTOR.
- GL. CONTRACTOR may be required to retain all records involving litigation proceedings and settlement of claims for a longer term which will be directed by the ADMINISTRATOR.
- **HM**. CONTRACTOR shall notify ADMINISTRATOR of any PRA requests related to, or arising out of, this Agreement, within forty-eight (48) hours. CONTRACTOR shall provide ADMINISTRATOR all information that is requested by the PRA request.

XXI. RESEARCH AND PUBLICATION

CONTRACTOR shall not utilize information and data received from COUNTY or <u>arising out of</u>, or developed, as a result of this Agreement for the purpose of personal <u>or professional research</u>, or for publication.

XXII. RIGHT TO WORK AND. MINIMUM WAGE LAWS

A. In accordance with the United States Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, CONTRACTOR shall require its employees directly or indirectly providing service pursuant to this Agreement, in any manner whatsoever, to verify their identity and eligibility for employment in the United States. CONTRACTOR shall also require and verify that its contractors, subcontractors, or any other persons providing services pursuant to this Agreement, in any manner whatsoever, verify the identity of their employees and their eligibility for employment in the United States.

B_A. Pursuant to the United States of America Fair Labor Standard Act of 1938, as amended, and State of California Labor Code, §1178.5, CONTRACTOR—shall pay no less than the greater of the federal or California Minimum Wage to all its employees that directly or indirectly provide services pursuant to this Agreement, in any manner whatsoever. CONTRACTOR shall require and verify that all

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36 37 its contractors or other persons providing services pursuant to this Agreement on behalf of CONTRACTOR also pay their employees no less than the greater of the federal or California Minimum Wage.

EB. CONTRACTOR shall comply and verify that its contractors comply with all other federal and State of California laws for minimum wage, overtime pay, record keeping, and child labor standards pursuant to providing services pursuant to this Agreement.

DC. Notwithstanding the minimum wage requirements provided for in this clause, CONTRACTOR, where applicable, shall comply with the prevailing wage and related requirements, as provided for in accordance with the provisions of Article 2 of Chapter 1, Part 7, Division 2 of the Labor Code of the State of California (§§1770, et seq.), as it exists or may hereafter be amended.

XXIII. SEVERABILITY

If a court of competent jurisdiction declares any provision of this Agreement or application thereof to any person or circumstances to be invalid or if any provision of this Agreement contravenes any federal, state or county statute, ordinance, or regulation, the remaining provisions of this Agreement or the application thereof shall remain valid, and the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect, and to that extent the provisions of this Agreement are severable.

XXIV. SPECIAL PROVISIONS

- A. CONTRACTOR shall not use the funds provided by means of this Agreement for the following purposes:
 - 1. Making cash payments to intended recipients of services through this Agreement.
- 2. Lobbying any governmental agency or official. CONTRACTOR shall file all certifications and reports in compliance with this requirement pursuant to Title 31, USC, §1352 (e.g., limitation on use of appropriated funds to influence certain federal contracting and financial transactions).
 - 3. Fundraising.
- 4. Purchase of gifts, meals, entertainment, awards, or other personal expenses for CONTRACTOR's staff, volunteers, or members of the Board of Directors or governing body.
- 5. Reimbursement of CONTRACTOR's members of the Board of Directors or governing body for expenses or services.
- 6. Making personal loans to CONTRACTOR's staff, volunteers, interns, consultants, subcontractors, and members of the Board of Directors or governing body, or its designee or authorized agent, or making salary advances or giving bonuses to CONTRACTOR's staff.
- 7. Paying an individual salary or compensation for services at a rate in excess of the current Level I of the Executive Salary Schedule as published by the OPM. The OPM Executive Salary Schedule may be found at www.opm.gov.
 - 8. Severance pay for separating employees.

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- 9. Paying rent and/or lease costs for a facility prior to the facility meeting all required building codes and obtaining all necessary building permits for any associated construction.
 - 10. Supplanting current funding for existing services.
- B. Unless otherwise specified in advance and in writing by ADMINISTRATOR, CONTRACTOR shall not use the funds provided by means of this Agreement for the following purposes:
 - 1. Funding travel or training (excluding mileage or parking).
- 2. Making phone calls outside of the local area unless documented to be directly for the purpose of elient participant care.
 - 3. Payment for grant writing, consultants, certified public accounting, or legal services.
- 4. Purchase of artwork or other items that are for decorative purposes and do not directly contribute to the quality of services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement.
- 5. Purchasing or improving land, including constructing or permanently improving any building or facility, except for tenant improvements.
 - 6. Providing inpatient hospital services or purchasing major medical equipment.
- 7. Satisfying any expenditure of non-federal funds as a condition for the receipt of federal funds (matching).
- 8. Purchase of gifts, meals, entertainment, awards, or other personal expenses for CONTRACTOR's clients participants.

XXV. STATUS OF CONTRACTOR

Each party is, and shall at all times be deemed to be, an independent contractor and shall be wholly responsible for the manner in which it performs the services required of it by the terms of this Agreement. Each party is entirely responsible for compensating staff, subcontractors, and consultants employed by that party. This Agreement shall not be construed as creating the relationship of employer and employee, or principal and agent, between COUNTY and CONTRACTOR or any of either party's employees, agents, consultants, or subcontractors. Each party assumes exclusively the responsibility for the acts of its employees, agents, consultants, or subcontractors as they relate to the services to be provided during the course and scope of their employment. Each party, its agents, employees, consultants, or subcontractors, shall not be entitled to any rights or privileges of the other party's employees and shall not be considered in any manner to be employees of the other party.

XXVI. TERM

A. The term of this Agreement shall commence and as specified in the Referenced Contract Provisions of this Agreement or the execution date, whichever is later. This Agreement shall terminate as specified in the Referenced Contract Provisions of this Agreement, unless otherwise sooner terminated as provided in this Agreement; provided, however, CONTRACTOR shall be obligated to perform such duties as would normally extend beyond this term, including but not limited to, obligations

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with respect to confidentiality, indemnification, audits, reporting and accounting.

B. Any administrative duty or obligation to be performed pursuant to this Agreement on a weekend or holiday may be performed on the next regular business day.

XXVII. TERMINATION

- A. Either party may terminate this Agreement, without cause, upon thirty (30), calendar daysdays' written notice given the other party.
- B. Unless otherwise specified in this Agreement, COUNTY may terminate this Agreement upon five (5) calendar daysdays' written notice if CONTRACTOR fails to perform any of the terms of this Agreement. At ADMINISTRATOR's sole discretion, CONTRACTOR may be allowed up to thirty (30) alendar days for corrective action.
- C. COUNTY may terminate this Agreement immediately, upon written notice, on the occurrence of any of the following events:
 - 1. The loss by CONTRACTOR of legal capacity.
 - 2. Cessation of services.
- 3. The delegation or assignment of CONTRACTOR's services, operation or administration to another entity without the prior written consent of COUNTY.
- 4. The neglect by any physician or licensed person employed by CONTRACTOR of any duty required pursuant to this Agreement.
- 5. The loss of accreditation or any license required by the Licenses and Laws Paragraph of this Agreement.
- 6. The continued incapacity of any physician or licensed person to perform duties required oursuant to this Agreement.
- 7. Unethical conduct or malpractice by any physician or licensed person providing services pursuant to this Agreement; provided, however, COUNTY may waive this option if CONTRACTOR emoves such physician or licensed person from serving persons treated or assisted pursuant to this Agreement.

D. CONTINGENT FUNDING

- 1. Any obligation of COUNTY under this Agreement is contingent upon the following:
- a. The continued availability of federal, state and county funds for reimbursement of COUNTY's expenditures, and
- b. Inclusion of sufficient funding for the services hereunder in the applicable budget(s) approved by the Board of Supervisors.
- 2. In the event such funding is subsequently reduced or terminated, COUNTY may suspend, terminate or renegotiate this Agreement upon thirty (30) calendar days days' written notice given CONTRACTOR. If COUNTY elects to renegotiate this Agreement due to reduced or terminated funding, CONTRACTOR shall not be obligated to accept the renegotiated terms.

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- E. In the event this Agreement is suspended or terminated prior to the completion of the term as specified in the Referenced Contract Provisions of this Agreement, ADMINISTRATOR may, at its sole discretion, reduce the Maximum Obligation of this Agreement in an amount consistent with the reduced term of the Agreement.
- F. In the event this Agreement is terminated by either party pursuant to Subparagraphs B., C. or D. above, CONTRACTOR shall do the following:
- 1. Comply with termination instructions provided by ADMINISTRATOR in a manner which is consistent with recognized standards of quality care and prudent business practice.
- 2. Obtain immediate clarification from ADMINISTRATOR of any unsettled issues of contract performance during the remaining contract term.
- 3. Until the date of termination, continue to provide the same level of service required by this Agreement.
- 4. If <u>clientsparticipants</u> are to be transferred to another facility for services, furnish ADMINISTRATOR, upon request, all <u>clientparticipant</u> information and records deemed necessary by ADMINISTRATOR to effect an orderly transfer.
- 5. Assist ADMINISTRATOR in effecting the transfer of <u>elientsparticipants</u> in a manner consistent with <u>elient'sparticipant's</u> best interests.
- 6. If records are to be transferred to COUNTY, pack and label such records in accordance with directions provided by ADMINISTRATOR.
- 7. Return to COUNTY, in the manner indicated by ADMINISTRATOR, any equipment and supplies purchased with funds provided by COUNTY.
- 8. To the extent services are terminated, cancel outstanding commitments covering the procurement of materials, supplies, equipment, and miscellaneous items, as well as outstanding commitments which relate to personal services. With respect to these canceled commitments, CONTRACTOR shall submit a written plan for settlement of all outstanding liabilities and all claims arising out of such cancellation of commitment which shall be subject to written approval of ADMINISTRATOR.
- G. The rights and remedies of COUNTY provided in this Termination Paragraph shall not be exclusive, and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under this Agreement.

XXVIII. THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARY

Neither party hereto intends that this Agreement shall create rights hereunder in third parties including, but not limited to, any subcontractors or any elients participants provided services pursuant to this Agreement.

XXIX. WAIVER OF DEFAULT OR BREACH

Waiver by COUNTY of any default by CONTRACTOR shall not be considered a waiver of any

27	Agreement.
28	4. The parties intend to protect the privacy and provide for the security of PHI that may be
29	created, received, maintained, transmitted, used, or disclosed pursuant to the Agreement in compliance
30	with the applicable standards, implementation specifications, and requirements of HIPAA, the HITECH
31	Act, and the HIPAA regulations as they may exist now or be hereafter amended.
32	5. The parties understand and acknowledge that HIPAA, the HITECH Act, and the HIPAA
33	regulations do not pre-empt any state statutes, rules, or regulations that are not otherwise pre-empted by
34	other Federal law(s) and impose more stringent requirements with respect to privacy of PHI.
35	6. The parties understand that the HIPAA Privacy and Security rules, as defined below in
36	Subparagraphs B.9 and B.14, apply to the CONTRACTOR in the same manner as they apply to the
37	covered entity (COUNTY). CONTRACTOR agrees therefore to be in compliance at all times with the

1	terms of this Business Associate Contract and the applicable standards, implementation specifications,
2	and requirements of the Privacy and the Security rules, as they may exist now or be hereafter amended,
3	with respect to PHI and electronic PHI created, received, maintained, transmitted, used, or disclosed
4	pursuant to the Agreement.
5	B. DEFINITIONS
6	1. "Administrative Safeguards" are administrative actions, and policies and procedures, to
7	manage the selection, development, implementation, and maintenance of security measures to protect
8	electronic PHI and to manage the conduct of CONTRACTOR's workforce in relation to the protection
9	of that information.
10	2. "Breach" means the acquisition, access, use, or disclosure of PHI in a manner not permitted
11	under the HIPAA Privacy Rule which compromises the security or privacy of the PHI.
12	a. Breach excludes:
13	1) Any unintentional acquisition, access, or use of PHI by a workforce member or
14	person acting under the authority of CONTRACTOR or COUNTY, if such acquisition, access, or use
15	was made in good faith and within the scope of authority and does not result in further use or disclosure
16	in a manner not permitted under the Privacy Rule.
17	2) Any inadvertent disclosure by a person who is authorized to access PHI at
18	CONTRACTOR to another person authorized to access PHI at the CONTRACTOR, or organized health
19	care arrangement in which COUNTY participates, and the information received as a result of such
20	disclosure is not further used or disclosed in a manner not permitted under the HIPAA Privacy Rule.
21	3) A disclosure of PHI where CONTRACTOR or COUNTY has a good faith belief
22	that an unauthorized person to whom the disclosure was made would not reasonably have been able to
23	retains such information.
24	b. Except as provided in paragraph (a) of this definition, an acquisition, access, use, or
25	disclosure of PHI in a manner not permitted under the HIPAA Privacy Rule is presumed to be a breach
26	unless CONTRACTOR demonstrates that there is a low probability that the PHI has been compromised
27	based on a risk assessment of at least the following factors:
28	1) The nature and extent of the PHI involved, including the types of identifiers and the
29	likelihood of re-identification;
30	2) The unauthorized person who used the PHI or to whom the disclosure was made;
31	3) Whether the PHI was actually acquired or viewed; and
32	4) The extent to which the risk to the PHI has been mitigated.
33	3. "Data Aggregation" shall have the meaning given to such term under the HIPAA Privacy
34	Rule in 45 CFR § 164.501.
35	4. "DRS" shall have the meaning given to such term under the HIPAA Privacy Rule in 45
36	<u>CFR § 164.501.</u>
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1	5. "Disclosure" shall have the meaning given to such term under the HIPAA regulations in 45
2	<u>CFR § 160.103.</u>
3	6. "Health Care Operations" shall have the meaning given to such term under the HIPAA
4	Privacy Rule in 45 CFR § 164.501.
5	7. "Individual" shall have the meaning given to such term under the HIPAA Privacy Rule in
6	45 CFR § 160.103 and shall include a person who qualifies as a personal representative in accordance
7	with 45 CFR § 164.502(g).
8	8. "Physical Safeguards" are physical measures, policies, and procedures to protect
9	CONTRACTOR's electronic information systems and related buildings and equipment, from natural
10	and environmental hazards, and unauthorized intrusion.
11	9. "The HIPAA Privacy Rule" shall mean the Standards for Privacy of Individually
12	Identifiable Health Information at 45 CFR Part 160 and Part 164, Subparts A and E.
13	10. "PHI" shall have the meaning given to such term under the HIPAA regulations in 45 CFR §
14	<u>160.103.</u>
15	11. "Required by Law" shall have the meaning given to such term under the HIPAA Privacy
16	Rule in 45 CFR § 164.103.
17	12. "Secretary" shall mean the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services or
18	his or her designee.
19	13. "Security Incident" means attempted or successful unauthorized access, use, disclosure,
20	modification, or destruction of information or interference with system operations in an information
21	system. "Security incident" does not include trivial incidents that occur on a daily basis, such as scans,
22	"pings", or unsuccessful attempts to penetrate computer networks or servers maintained by
23	CONTRACTOR.
24	14. "The HIPAA Security Rule" shall mean the Security Standards for the Protection of
25	electronic PHI at 45 CFR Part 160, Part 162, and Part 164, Subparts A and C. 15. "Subcontractor" shall have the meaning given to such term under the HIPAA regulations in
26	45 CFR § 160.103.
27	16. "Technical safeguards" means the technology and the policy and procedures for its use that
28 29	protect electronic PHI and control access to it.
30	17. "Unsecured PHI" or "PHI that is unsecured" means PHI that is not rendered unusable,
31	unreadable, or indecipherable to unauthorized individuals through the use of a technology or
32	methodology specified by the Secretary of Health and Human Services in the guidance issued on the
33	HHS Web site.
34	18. "Use" shall have the meaning given to such term under the HIPAA regulations in 45 CFR §
35	160.103.
36	<u>//</u>
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1	C. OBLIGATIONS AND ACTIVITIES OF CONTRACTOR AS BUSINESS ASSOCIATE:
2	1. CONTRACTOR agrees not to use or further disclose PHI COUNTY discloses to
3	CONTRACTOR other than as permitted or required by this Business Associate Contract or as required
4	by law.
5	2. CONTRACTOR agrees to use appropriate safeguards, as provided for in this Business
6	Associate Contract and the Agreement, to prevent use or disclosure of PHI COUNTY discloses to
7	CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY
8	other than as provided for by this Business Associate Contract.
9	3. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with the HIPAA Security Rule at Subpart C of 45 CFR
10	Part 164 with respect to electronic PHI COUNTY discloses to CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR
11	creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY.
12	4. CONTRACTOR agrees to mitigate, to the extent practicable, any harmful effect that is
13	known to CONTRACTOR of a Use or Disclosure of PHI by CONTRACTOR in violation of the
14	requirements of this Business Associate Contract.
15	5. CONTRACTOR agrees to report to COUNTY immediately any Use or Disclosure of PHI
16	not provided for by this Business Associate Contract of which CONTRACTOR becomes aware.
17	CONTRACTOR must report Breaches of Unsecured PHI in accordance with subparagraph E below and
18	as required by 45 CFR § 164.410.
19	6. CONTRACTOR agrees to ensure that any Subcontractors that create, receive, maintain, or
20	transmit PHI on behalf of CONTRACTOR agree to the same restrictions and conditions that apply
21	through this Business Associate Contract to CONTRACTOR with respect to such information.
22	7. CONTRACTOR agrees to provide access, within fifteen (15) calendar days of receipt of a
23	written request by COUNTY, to PHI in a DRS, to COUNTY or, as directed by COUNTY, to an
24	Individual in order to meet the requirements under 45 CFR § 164.524. If CONTRACTOR maintains an
25	EHR with PHI, and an individual requests a copy of such information in an electronic format,
26	CONTRACTOR shall provide such information in an electronic format.
27	8. CONTRACTOR agrees to make any amendment(s) to PHI in a DRS that COUNTY directs
28	or agrees to pursuant to 45 CFR § 164.526 at the request of COUNTY or an Individual, within thirty
29	(30) calendar days of receipt of said request by COUNTY. CONTRACTOR agrees to notify COUNTY
30	in writing no later than ten (10) calendar days after said amendment is completed.
31	9. CONTRACTOR agrees to make internal practices, books, and records, including P&Ps,
32	relating to the use and disclosure of PHI received from, or created or received by CONTRACTOR on
33	behalf of, COUNTY available to COUNTY and the Secretary in a time and manner as determined by
34	COUNTY or as designated by the Secretary for purposes of the Secretary determining COUNTY's
35	compliance with the HIPAA Privacy Rule.
36	10. CONTRACTOR agrees to document any Disclosures of PHI COUNTY discloses to
37	CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY,
	4 of 15 EXHIBIT B

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and to make information related to such Disclosures available as would be required for COUNTY to respond to a request by an Individual for an accounting of Disclosures of PHI in accordance with 45 CFR § 164.528.

- 11. CONTRACTOR agrees to provide COUNTY or an Individual, as directed by COUNTY, in a time and manner to be determined by COUNTY, that information collected in accordance with the Agreement, in order to permit COUNTY to respond to a request by an Individual for an accounting of Disclosures of PHI in accordance with 45 CFR § 164.528.
- 12. CONTRACTOR agrees that to the extent CONTRACTOR carries out COUNTY's obligation under the HIPAA Privacy and/or Security rules CONTRACTOR will comply with the requirements of 45 CFR Part 164 that apply to COUNTY in the performance of such obligation.
- 13. If CONTRACTOR receives Social Security data from COUNTY provided to COUNTY by a state agency, upon request by COUNTY, CONTRACTOR shall provide COUNTY with a list of all employees, subcontractors, and agents who have access to the Social Security data, including employees, agents, subcontractors, and agents of its subcontractors.
- 14. CONTRACTOR will notify COUNTY if CONTRACTOR is named as a defendant in a criminal proceeding for a violation of HIPAA. COUNTY may terminate the Agreement, if CONTRACTOR is found guilty of a criminal violation in connection with HIPAA. COUNTY may terminate the Agreement, if a finding or stipulation that CONTRACTOR has violated any standard or requirement of the privacy or security provisions of HIPAA, or other security or privacy laws are made in any administrative or civil proceeding in which CONTRACTOR is a party or has been joined. COUNTY will consider the nature and seriousness of the violation in deciding whether or not to terminate the Agreement.
- 15 CONTRACTOR shall make itself and any subcontractors, employees or agents assisting CONTRACTOR in the performance of its obligations under the Agreement, available to COUNTY at no cost to COUNTY to testify as witnesses, or otherwise, in the event of litigation or administrative proceedings being commenced against COUNTY, its directors, officers or employees based upon claimed violation of HIPAA, the HIPAA regulations or other laws relating to security and privacy, which involves inactions or actions by CONTRACTOR, except where CONTRACTOR or its subcontractor, employee, or agent is a named adverse party.
- 16. The Parties acknowledge that federal and state laws relating to electronic data security and privacy are rapidly evolving and that amendment of this Business Associate Contract may be required to provide for procedures to ensure compliance with such developments. The Parties specifically agree to take such action as is necessary to implement the standards and requirements of HIPAA, the HITECH Act, the HIPAA regulations and other applicable laws relating to the security or privacy of PHI. Upon COUNTY's request, CONTRACTOR agrees to promptly enter into negotiations with COUNTY concerning an amendment to this Business Associate Contract embodying written assurances consistent with the standards and requirements of HIPAA, the HITECH Act, the HIPAA regulations or other

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1	applicable laws. COUNTY may terminate the Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice in the
2	event:
3	a. CONTRACTOR does not promptly enter into negotiations to amend this Business
4	Associate Contract when requested by COUNTY pursuant to this subparagraph C; or
5	b. CONTRACTOR does not enter into an amendment providing assurances regarding the
6	safeguarding of PHI that COUNTY deems are necessary to satisfy the standards and requirements of
7	HIPAA, the HITECH Act, and the HIPAA regulations.
8	17. CONTRACTOR shall work with COUNTY upon notification by CONTRACTOR to
9	COUNTY of a Breach to properly determine if any Breach exclusions exist as defined in Subparagraph
10	B.2.a above.
11	D. SECURITY RULE
12	1. CONTRACTOR shall comply with the requirements of 45 CFR § 164.306 and establish
13	and maintain appropriate Administrative, Physical and Technical Safeguards in accordance with 45 CFR
14	§ 164.308, § 164.310, and § 164.312, with respect to electronic PHI COUNTY discloses to
15	CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY.
16	CONTRACTOR shall develop and maintain a written information privacy and security program that
17	includes Administrative, Physical, and Technical Safeguards appropriate to the size and complexity of
18	CONTRACTOR's operations and the nature and scope of its activities.
19	2. CONTRACTOR shall implement reasonable and appropriate policies and procedures to
20	comply with the standards, implementation specifications and other requirements of 45 CFR Part 164,
21	Subpart C, in compliance with 45 CFR § 164.316. CONTRACTOR will provide COUNTY with its
22	current and updated policies upon request.
23	3. CONTRACTOR shall ensure the continuous security of all computerized data systems
24	containing electronic PHI COUNTY discloses to CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives,
25	maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY. CONTRACTOR shall protect paper documents
26	containing PHI COUNTY discloses to CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains,
27	or transmits on behalf of COUNTY. These steps shall include, at a minimum:
28	a. Complying with all of the data system security precautions listed under subparagraphs
29	E, below;
30	b. Achieving and maintaining compliance with the HIPAA Security Rule, as necessary in
31	conducting operations on behalf of COUNTY;
32	c. Providing a level and scope of security that is at least comparable to the level and scope
33	of security established by the OMB in OMB Circular No. A-130, Appendix III - Security of Federal
34	Automated Information Systems, which sets forth guidelines for automated information systems in
35	Federal agencies;
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1	4. CONTRACTOR shall ensure that any subcontractors that create, receive, maintain, or
2	transmit ePHI on behalf of CONTRACTOR agree through a contract with CONTRACTOR to the same
3	restrictions and requirements contained in this subparagraph D of this Business Associate Contract.
4	5. CONTRACTOR shall report to COUNTY immediately any Security Incident of which it
5	becomes aware. CONTRACTOR shall report Breaches of Unsecured PHI in accordance with
6	subparagraph E below and as required by 45 CFR § 164.410.
7	6. CONTRACTOR shall designate a Security Officer to oversee its data security program who
8	shall be responsible for carrying out the requirements of this paragraph and for communicating on
9	security matters with COUNTY.
10	E. DATA SECURITY REQUIREMENTS
11	1. Personal Controls
12	a. Employee Training. All workforce members who assist in the performance of functions
13	or activities on behalf of COUNTY in connection with Agreement, or access or disclose PHI COUNTY
14	discloses to CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of
15	COUNTY, must complete information privacy and security training, at least annually, at
16	CONTRACTOR's expense. Each workforce member who receives information privacy and security
17	training must sign a certification, indicating the member's name and the date on which the training was
18	completed. These certifications must be retained for a period of six (6) years following the termination
19	of Agreement.
20	b. Employee Discipline. Appropriate sanctions must be applied against workforce
21	members who fail to comply with any provisions of CONTRACTOR's privacy P&Ps, including
22	termination of employment where appropriate.
23	c. Confidentiality Statement. All persons that will be working with PHI COUNTY
24	discloses to CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of
25	COUNTY must sign a confidentiality statement that includes, at a minimum, General Use, Security and
26	Privacy Safeguards, Unacceptable Use, and Enforcement Policies. The statement must be signed by the
27	workforce member prior to access to such PHI. The statement must be renewed annually. The
28	CONTRACTOR shall retain each person's written confidentiality statement for COUNTY inspection for
29	a period of six (6) years following the termination of the Agreement.
30	d. Background Check. Before a member of the workforce may access PHI COUNTY
31	discloses to CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of
32	COUNTY, a background screening of that worker must be conducted. The screening should be
33	commensurate with the risk and magnitude of harm the employee could cause, with more thorough
34	screening being done for those employees who are authorized to bypass significant technical and
35	operational security controls. The CONTRACTOR shall retain each workforce member's background
36	check documentation for a period of three (3) years.
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1	2. Technical Security Controls
2	a. Workstation/Laptop encryption. All workstations and laptops that store PHI COUNTY
3	discloses to CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of
4	COUNTY either directly or temporarily must be encrypted using a FIPS 140-2 certified algorithm which
5	is 128bit or higher, such as AES. The encryption solution must be full disk unless approved by the
6	COUNTY.
7	b. Server Security. Servers containing unencrypted PHI COUNTY discloses to
8	CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY
9	must have sufficient administrative, physical, and technical controls in place to protect that data, based
10	upon a risk assessment/system security review.
11	c. Minimum Necessary. Only the minimum necessary amount of PHI COUNTY discloses
12	to CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY
13	required to perform necessary business functions may be copied, downloaded, or exported.
14	d. Removable media devices. All electronic files that contain PHI COUNTY discloses to
15	CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY
16	must be encrypted when stored on any removable media or portable device (i.e. USB thumb drives,
17	floppies, CD/DVD, Blackberry, backup tapes etc.). Encryption must be a FIPS 140-2 certified algorithm
18	which is 128bit or higher, such as AES. Such PHI shall not be considered "removed from the premises"
19	if it is only being transported from one of CONTRACTOR's locations to another of CONTRACTOR's
20	<u>locations.</u>
21	e. Antivirus software. All workstations, laptops and other systems that process and/or
22	store PHI COUNTY discloses to CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or
23	transmits on behalf of COUNTY must have installed and actively use comprehensive anti-virus software
24	solution with automatic updates scheduled at least daily.
25	f. Patch Management. All workstations, laptops and other systems that process and/or
26	store PHI COUNTY discloses to CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or
27	transmits on behalf of COUNTY must have critical security patches applied, with system reboot if
28	necessary. There must be a documented patch management process which determines installation
29	timeframe based on risk assessment and vendor recommendations. At a maximum, all applicable
30	patches must be installed within thirty (30) calendar or business days of vendor release. Applications
31	and systems that cannot be patched due to operational reasons must have compensatory controls
32	implemented to minimize risk, where possible.
33	g. User IDs and Password Controls. All users must be issued a unique user name for
34	accessing PHI COUNTY discloses to CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains,
35	or transmits on behalf of COUNTY. Username must be promptly disabled, deleted, or the password
36	changed upon the transfer or termination of an employee with knowledge of the password, at maximum
37	within twenty-four (24) hours. Passwords are not to be shared. Passwords must be at least eight

1	characters and must be a non-dictionary word. Passwords must not be stored in readable format on the
2	computer. Passwords must be changed every ninety (90) days, preferably every sixty (60) days.
3	Passwords must be changed if revealed or compromised. Passwords must be composed of characters
4	from at least three (3) of the following four (4) groups from the standard keyboard:
5	1) Upper case letters (A-Z)
6	2) Lower case letters (a-z)
7	3) Arabic numerals (0-9)
8	4) Non-alphanumeric characters (punctuation symbols)
9	h. Data Destruction. When no longer needed, all PHI COUNTY discloses to
10	CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY
11	must be wiped using the Gutmann or DoD 5220.22-M (7 Pass) standard, or by degaussing. Media may
12	also be physically destroyed in accordance with NIST Special Publication 800-88. Other methods
13	require prior written permission by COUNTY.
14	i. System Timeout. The system providing access to PHI COUNTY discloses to
15	CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY
16	must provide an automatic timeout, requiring re-authentication of the user session after no more than
17	twenty (20) minutes of inactivity.
18	j. Warning Banners. All systems providing access to PHI COUNTY discloses to
19	CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY
20	must display a warning banner stating that data is confidential, systems are logged, and system use is for
21	business purposes only by authorized users. User must be directed to log off the system if they do not
22	agree with these requirements.
23	k. System Logging. The system must maintain an automated audit trail which can identify
24	the user or system process which initiates a request for PHI COUNTY discloses to CONTRACTOR or
25	CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY, or which alters such
26	PHI. The audit trail must be date and time stamped, must log both successful and failed accesses, must
27	be read only, and must be restricted to authorized users. If such PHI is stored in a database, database
28	logging functionality must be enabled. Audit trail data must be archived for at least 3 years after
29	occurrence.
30	1. Access Controls. The system providing access to PHI COUNTY discloses to
31	CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY
32	must use role based access controls for all user authentications, enforcing the principle of least privilege.
33	m. Transmission encryption. All data transmissions of PHI COUNTY discloses to
34	CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY
35	outside the secure internal network must be encrypted using a FIPS 140-2 certified algorithm which is
36	128bit or higher, such as AES. Encryption can be end to end at the network level, or the data files
37	lacksquare

1	containing PHI can be encrypted. This requirement pertains to any type of PHI in motion such as
2	website access, file transfer, and E-Mail.
3	n. Intrusion Detection. All systems involved in accessing, holding, transporting, and
4	protecting PHI COUNTY discloses to CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains,
5	or transmits on behalf of COUNTY that are accessible via the Internet must be protected by a
6	comprehensive intrusion detection and prevention solution.
7	3. Audit Controls
8	a. System Security Review. CONTRACTOR must ensure audit control mechanisms that
9	record and examine system activity are in place. All systems processing and/or storing PHI COUNTY
10	discloses to CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of
11	COUNTY must have at least an annual system risk assessment/security review which provides
12	assurance that administrative, physical, and technical controls are functioning effectively and providing
13	adequate levels of protection. Reviews should include vulnerability scanning tools.
14	b. Log Reviews. All systems processing and/or storing PHI COUNTY discloses to
15	CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY
16	must have a routine procedure in place to review system logs for unauthorized access.
17	c. Change Control. All systems processing and/or storing PHI COUNTY discloses to
18	CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of COUNTY
19	must have a documented change control procedure that ensures separation of duties and protects the
20	confidentiality, integrity and availability of data.
21	4. Business Continuity/Disaster Recovery Control
22	a. Emergency Mode Operation Plan. CONTRACTOR must establish a documented plan
23	to enable continuation of critical business processes and protection of the security of PHI COUNTY
24	discloses to CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of
25	COUNTY kept in an electronic format in the event of an emergency. Emergency means any
26	circumstance or situation that causes normal computer operations to become unavailable for use in
27	performing the work required under this Agreement for more than 24 hours.
28	b. Data Backup Plan. CONTRACTOR must have established documented procedures to
29	backup such PHI to maintain retrievable exact copies of the PHI. The plan must include a regular
30	schedule for making backups, storing backup offsite, an inventory of backup media, and an estimate of
31	the amount of time needed to restore DHCS PHI or PI should it be lost. At a minimum, the schedule
32	must be a weekly full backup and monthly offsite storage of DHCS data. BCP for contractor and
33	COUNTY (e.g. the application owner) must merge with the DRP.
34	5. Paper Document Controls

27	COUNTY of such Breach, however both parties agree to a delay in the notification if so advised by a
28	law enforcement official pursuant to 45 CFR § 164.412.
29	a. A Breach shall be treated as discovered by CONTRACTOR as of the first day on which

2	a. The identification of each Individual whose Unsecured PHI has been, or is reasonably

4	b. Any other information that COUNTY is required to include in the notification to
5	Individual under 45 CFR §164.404 (c) at the time CONTRACTOR is required to notify COUNTY or
6	promptly thereafter as this information becomes available, even after the regulatory sixty (60) day period
7	set forth in 45 CFR § 164.410 (b) has elapsed, including:
8	1) A brief description of what happened, including the date of the Breach and the date
9	of the discovery of the Breach, if known;
10	2) A description of the types of Unsecured PHI that were involved in the Breach (such
11	as whether full name, social security number, date of birth, home address, account number, diagnosis,
12	disability code, or other types of information were involved);
13	3) Any steps Individuals should take to protect themselves from potential harm
14	resulting from the Breach;
15	4) A brief description of what CONTRACTOR is doing to investigate the Breach, to
16	mitigate harm to Individuals, and to protect against any future Breaches; and
17	5) Contact procedures for Individuals to ask questions or learn additional information,

13	Any reference to statutory, regulatory, or contractual language herein shall be to such language as in

16	1. "Breach" shall have the meaning given to such term under the IEA and CMPPA. It shall
17	include a "PII loss" as that term is defined in the CMPPA.
18	2. "Breach of the security of the system" shall have the meaning given to such term under the
19	CIPA, Civil Code § 1798.29(d).
20	3. "CMPPA Agreement" means the CMPPA Agreement between the SSA and CHHS.
21	4. "DHCS PI" shall mean Personal Information, as defined below, accessed in a database
22	maintained by the COUNTY or DHCS, received by CONTRACTOR from the COUNTY or DHCS or
23	acquired or created by CONTRACTOR in connection with performing the functions, activities and
24	services specified in the Agreement on behalf of the COUNTY.5. "IEA" shall mean the Information Exchange Agreement currently in effect between the SSA
25	and DHCS.
26	6. "Notice-triggering Personal Information" shall mean the personal information identified in
27	California Civil Code § 1798.29(e) whose unauthorized access may trigger notification requirements
28	under California Civil Code § 1709.29. For purposes of this provision, identity shall include, but not be
29 30	limited to, name, identifying number, symbol, or other identifying particular assigned to the individual,
31	such as a finger or voice print, a photograph or a biometric identifier. Notice-triggering PI includes PI in
32	electronic, paper or any other medium.
33	7. "PII" shall have the meaning given to such term in the IEA and CMPPA.
34	8. "PI" shall have the meaning given to such term in California Civil Code§ 1798.3(a).
35	9. "Required by law" means a mandate contained in law that compels an entity to make a use
36	or disclosure of PI or PII that is enforceable in a court of law. This includes, but is not limited to, court
37	orders and court-ordered warrants, subpoenas or summons issued by a court, grand jury, a governmental
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or tribal inspector general, or an administrative body authorized to require the production of information, and a civil or an authorized investigative demand. It also includes Medicare conditions of participation with respect to health care providers participating in the program, and statutes or regulations that require the production of information, including statutes or regulations that require such information if payment is sought under a government program providing public benefits.

10. "Security Incident" means the attempted or successful unauthorized access, use, disclosure, modification, or destruction of PI, or confidential data utilized in complying with this Agreement; or interference with system operations in an information system that processes, maintains or stores Pl.

B. TERMS OF AGREEMENT

- 1. Permitted Uses and Disclosures of DHCS PI and PII by CONTRACTOR. Except as otherwise indicated in this Exhibit, CONTRACTOR may use or disclose DHCS PI only to perform functions, activities, or services for or on behalf of the COUNTY pursuant to the terms of the Agreement provided that such use or disclosure would not violate the CIPA if done by the COUNTY.
 - 2. Responsibilities of CONTRACTOR

CONTRACTOR agrees:

- a. Nondisclosure. Not to use or disclose DHCS PI or PII other than as permitted or required by this Personal Information Privacy and Security Contract or as required by applicable state and federal law.
- b. Safeguards. To implement appropriate and reasonable administrative, technical, and physical safeguards to protect the security, confidentiality and integrity of DHCS PI and PII, to protect against anticipated threats or hazards to the security or integrity of DHCS PI and PII, and to prevent use or disclosure of DHCS PI or PII other than as provided for by this Personal Information Privacy and Security Contract. CONTRACTOR shall develop and maintain a written information privacy and security program that include administrative, technical and physical safeguards appropriate to the size and complexity of CONTRACTOR's operations and the nature and scope of its activities, which incorporate the requirements of subparagraph (c), below. CONTRACTOR will provide COUNTY with its current policies upon request.
- c. Security. CONTRACTOR shall ensure the continuous security of all computerized data systems containing DHCS PI and PII. CONTRACTOR shall protect paper documents containing DHCS PI and PII. These steps shall include, at a minimum:
- Complying with all of the data system security precautions listed in subparagraph
 E of the Business Associate Contract, Exhibit B to the Agreement; and
- 2) Providing a level and scope of security that is at least comparable to the level and scope of security established by the Office of Management and Budget in OMB Circular No. A-130, Appendix III-Security of Federal Automated Information Systems, which sets forth guidelines for automated information systems in Federal agencies.

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- 3) If the data obtained by CONTRACTOR from COUNTY includes PII, CONTRACTOR shall also comply with the substantive privacy and security requirements in the CMPPA Agreement between the SSA and the CHHS and in the Agreement between the SSA and DHCS, known as the IEA. The specific sections of the IEA with substantive privacy and security requirements to be complied with are sections E, F, and G, and in Attachment 4 to the IEA, Electronic Information Exchange Security Requirements, Guidelines and Procedures for Federal, State and Local Agencies Exchanging Electronic Information with the SSA. CONTRACTOR also agrees to ensure that any of CONTRACTOR's agents or subcontractors, to whom CONTRACTOR provides DHCS PII agree to the same requirements for privacy and security safeguards for confidential data that apply to CONTRACTOR with respect to such information.
- d. Mitigation of Harmful Effects. To mitigate, to the extent practicable, any harmful effect that is known to CONTRACTOR of a use or disclosure of DHCS PI or PII by CONTRACTOR or its subcontractors in violation of this Personal Information Privacy and Security Contract.
- e. CONTRACTOR's Agents and Subcontractors. To impose the same restrictions and conditions set forth in this Personal Information and Security Contract on any subcontractors or other agents with whom CONTRACTOR subcontracts any activities under the Agreement that involve the disclosure of DHCS PI or PII to such subcontractors or other agents.
- f. Availability of Information. To make DHCS PI and PII available to the DHCS and/or COUNTY for purposes of oversight, inspection, amendment, and response to requests for records, injunctions, judgments, and orders for production of DHCS PI and PII. If CONTRACTOR receives DHCS PII, upon request by COUNTY and/or DHCS, CONTRACTOR shall provide COUNTY and/or DHCS with a list of all employees, contractors and agents who have access to DHCS PII, including employees, contractors and agents of its subcontractors and agents.
- g. Cooperation with COUNTY. With respect to DHCS PI, to cooperate with and assist the COUNTY to the extent necessary to ensure the DHCS's compliance with the applicable terms of the CIPA including, but not limited to, accounting of disclosures of DHCS PI, correction of errors in DHCS PI, production of DHCS PI, disclosure of a security Breach involving DHCS PI and notice of such Breach to the affected individual(s).
- h. Breaches and Security Incidents. During the term of the Agreement, CONTRACTOR agrees to implement reasonable systems for the discovery of any Breach of unsecured DHCS PI and PII or security incident. CONTRACTOR agrees to give notification of any beach of unsecured DHCS PI and PII or security incident in accordance with subparagraph F, of the Business Associate Contract, Exhibit B to the Agreement.
- i. Designation of Individual Responsible for Security. CONTRACTOR shall designate an individual, (e.g., Security Officer), to oversee its data security program who shall be responsible for carrying out the requirements of this Personal Information Privacy and Security Contract and for communicating on security matters with the COUNTY.
