So much money has come through the County and our unhoused folx are not fairing well. Where is the housing? You continue to fund Congregate Shelters that seldom lead to permanent affordable housing. Where is the housing? Encampments are growing and your providers best practices seem to involve law enforcement. Where is the housing?

It is so disappointing to see such little progress in actual numbers of folx placed in housing. Their own housing. Not a shared bedroom. Not a group living arrangement. Not a shelter.

Over the last few months many advocates have asked for support for El Centro Cultural de México in their plight to serve those on the streets of Santa Ana who have sought refuge on their property. Why would the city not help early on with trash pick up, sanitation and bring services on site to facilitate the needs as presented? Why would the county not step in since so many of their arrivals were from the courtyard and other failed experiences the county funds? Project Room key was meant for this population. The money has been there and FEMA is reimbursing at 100%. I can't wait to hear how much of a success story you try to paint for Room key, Home key and Tool belt efforts. The numbers truly assisted and now in permanent housing are abysmal for the monies used and available.

You need to step up now and support this community centered group who have done everything in their power to get help and have been continuously bullied in the process.
