County of Orange Report on Grant Applications/Awards

The Grants Report is a condensed list of grant requests by County Agencies/Departments that allows the Board of Supervisors to discuss and approve grant submittals in one motion at a Board meeting. County policy dictates that the Board of Supervisors must approve all grant applications prior to submittal to the grantor. This applies to grants of all amounts, as well as to new grants and those that have been received by the County for many years as part of an ongoing grant. Receipt of grants \$50,000 or less is delegated to the County Executive Officer. Grant awards greater than \$50,000 must be presented to the Board of Supervisors for receipt of funds. This report allows for better tracking of county grant requests, the success rate of our grants, and monitoring of County's grants activities. It also serves to inform Orange County's Sacramento and Washington, D.C. advocates of County grant activities involving the State or Federal Governments.

The CalCRG program was included in the Adult Use of Marijuana Act (Proposition 64), which was approved by California voters on November 8, 2016. This grant program targets communities disproportionately affected by past federal and state drug policies. The purpose of the grant program is to provide mental health treatment, substance use disorder treatment, job placement, system navigation services, legal services to address barriers to reentry, and linkages to medical care. The Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development issued a grant solicitation on April 22, 2019, with \$9.6 million available statewide for fiscal year 2018-19. Local Health Departments, as single County applicants, were eligible to apply for up to \$300,000 for the two year grant period.

On April 30, 2019, your Honorable Board authorized HCA to submit a CalCRG application. Based on the scope of work, Behavioral Health Services developed an application collaboratively with Correctional Health Services and Public Health Services.


On September 9, 2019, Orange County received a grant award letter and Grant Agreement, approving its grant application for \$300,000. The grant funding will be used to fund one half-time (0.5FTE)

correctional health nurse and one full time (1FTE) Project Kinship peer navigator, to facilitate system navigation services and linkages to medical and behavioral health services at time of release from custody at the Intake and Release Center (IRC). These positions will be part of a larger team that reviews discharge plans and coordinates transportation and warm hand-offs to mental health and substance use services, medical services, and supportive reentry services in the community at time of release. The grant term will be October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2021.

Each year since 2004, National Institute of Justice (NIJ) has solicited applications for the DNA Capacity Enhancement and Backlog Reduction Program. Each year, the Sheriff-Coroner Department (Sheriff) must submit a new application to NIJ in order to receive Orange County's share of the current year's funding that is allotted to California.

The NIJ provides funding through formula and discretionary awards to reduce evidence backlogs and improve the quality and timeliness of forensic science and medical examiner services. This program furthers the NIJ's mission by funding states and units of local government with existing crime laboratories that conduct DNA analysis to process, record, screen and analyze forensic DNA and or DNA database samples, and to increase the capacity of public forensic DNA and DNA database laboratories to process more DNA samples, thereby helping to reduce the number of forensic DNA and

DNA database samples awaiting analysis. Funds may be used to hire additional full-time or part-time laboratory employees to directly perform capacity enhancement-specific activities, such as validating new DNA analysis technologies for the forensic DNA laboratory and/or the laboratory responsible for analysis of DNA database samples. Matching funds are not required.

Sheriff intends to use the grant to fund analyst overtime to process backlogged DNA casework at the Orange County Crime Laboratory, purchase new laboratory equipment, replace aging batteries in the DNA Bureau's Uninterrupted Power Supply and fund mandatory continuing education training for DNA analysts.

The Selective Traffic Enforcement Program grant are funds intended to reduce the number of persons killed and injured in crashes involving alcohol, speed, red light running, and other primary collision factors. "Best practice" strategies, such as DUI saturation patrols to apprehend drunk drivers, warrant service operations targeting DUI violators who failed to appear in court or who violate probation, stakeouts, and court stings, may be utilized. Efforts may also target reducing speed, aggressive driving, seat belt enforcement, intersection operations with disproportionate numbers of traffic crashes, and special enforcement operations encouraging motorcycle safety. Increased DUI enforcement and an intensive media campaign will be conducted on a county-wide basis. Participating law enforcement agencies throughout the county, including the Alcohol Beverage Control and the California Highway Patrol, will conduct DUI enforcement activities during both summer and winter holidays, Memorial Day, Fourth of July weekend, and other special events with identified DUI problems. Activities include DUI checkpoints, DUI situational patrols, multi-agency DUI task

force operations, warrant/probation sweeps, and court sting operations for repeat DUI offenders. These strategies enhance media attention to provide an overall deterrent effect.

These grant-funded program activities will work in concert to assist law enforcement in their ongoing efforts to increase public safety. The grant period is October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020. Current grant funding now combines two previous grants (i.e., STEP Grant and the DUI Avoid Campaign Grant) which were combined into one in 2015.
