### **County of Orange Report on Grant Applications/Awards**

The Grants Report is a condensed list of grant requests by County Agencies/Departments that allows the Board of Supervisors to discuss and approve grant submittals in one motion at a Board meeting. County policy dictates that the Board of Supervisors must approve all grant applications prior to submittal to the grantor. This applies to grants of all amounts, as well as to new grants and those that have been received by the County for many years as part of an ongoing grant. Receipt of grants \$50,000 or less is delegated to the County Executive Officer. Grant awards greater than \$50,000 must be presented to the Board of Supervisors for receipt of funds. This report allows for better tracking of county grant requests, the success rate of our grants, and monitoring of County's grants activities. It also serves to inform Orange County's Sacramento and Washington, D.C. advocates of County grant activities involving the State or Federal Governments.

In 2014, the Social Services Agency (SSA) was awarded a grant from the California Department of Education (CDE), Early Education and Support Division, to provide full day/full-year preschool services to increase the availability of early education development programs to eligible preschool children so that more children from low and moderate-income families enter kindergarten ready to learn and succeed in school and in life. SSA utilized this funding in Fiscal Years 2016-17, 2017-18, and 2018-19 to support full-day/full-year preschool services at the Tustin Family Campus Early Childhood Development Center (the Center) for children involved in the child welfare system due to abuse and neglect. On March 23, 2018, the President signed Public Law 115-141, authorizing the 2018 Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) under the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS).

On May 21, 2018, the DHS issued guidance and budget allocations to the States. In California, the administering agency is the California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES), which issues guidance to eligible applicants (Operational Areas). The grant application is due by October 30, 2018. The Orange County Sheriff's Department is responsible for administering and distributing the grant funds on behalf of the Orange County Operational Area. The anticipated award date is unknown at this time. The anticipated award amount is \$775,004.

The purpose of the EMPG Program is to provide federal funds to states to assist state, local, and tribal governments in preparing for all hazards. Funds provided under the EMPG must be used to support activities that contribute to the Operational Area's capability to prevent, prepare for, mitigate against,

respond to, and recover from emergencies and disasters, whether natural or man-made. The grant-funded activities are a continuation of services funded by previous grant cycles. The goals described within the grant application relate to emergency management organizational and enterprise enhancement, managing risk and vulnerabilities, and enhancing customer and stakeholder services.

The grant includes a pass-through of \$368,127 to local cities. These funds are distributed on a population basis to those cities who wish to apply and complete the required activities. The Operational Area Executive Board reviewed the proposed application budget and required activities at their quarterly meeting on August 8, 2018.

The performance period of the award is July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019.

This grant has not been reviewed under the County Audit in the last 3 years.

Request to Approve Retroactive Grant Award for OC Parks

On September 4, 2018, OC Parks received an offer from the National Parks Service (NPS) of an award for the Save America's Treasures Historic Preservation Grant. OC Parks was one of 16 applicants awarded throughout the United States and was offered \$153,016. Save America's Treasures Awardees were directed by the National Park Service not to make any public notice of the award before the NPS announced the recipients on September 23, 2018. Because the agenda for the September 25, 2018 Board of Supervisors meeting would be posted on September 20, 2018; October 16, 2018 was the first meeting date available to submit this item while also meeting the NPS requirements. The attached eForm has been prepared for inclusion in the October 16, 2018 grants report. This date falls after the thirty-day award notification deadline.

Funding from the Save America's Treasures grant will be used to restore the upper floor of the Stone House at Arden, the Helena Modieska Historic House and Gardens. This structure may have been built as early as the 1860s, making it one of the oldest extant constructions in Orange County. It is an important contributing building to the site's National Historic Landmark status. The ground level stone floor of the building underwent seismic stabilization and restoration in 2008. Although the wood upper floor and roof have been protected from the elements using interim measures, this part of the structure was becoming endangered due to age and external conditions. This grant will allow OC Parks to restore the remaining portion of the Stone House, completing its preservation and making it available to the public for the first time in the buildings history.

In August 2018, OC Parks identified a need and began preparation of an application for \$194,160 to the State of California, Department of Parks and Recreation, Habitat Conservation Fund Program Grant to restore the lake at Ted Craig Regional Park. The eForm requesting permission to apply was prepared on time for the September 25, 2018 Grants Report however, due to an email error, the item was not included in that report. The error was not detected until the report was posted. October 16, 2018 is the next scheduled Board of Supervisors meeting. The attached eForm has been prepared for inclusion in the October 16, 2018 grants report. This date falls after the application due date of October 1, 2018.

Resources

If awarded, grants funds will be used to restore the deteriorating earthen lake edge and improve the water quality of the Ted Craig Regional Park Lake (Craig Lake). An ecological system will be used to dredge the shallow sediment from the lake bottom, which will be pumped into DredgeSox ® for installation along the 3-acre lake edge. The encased, dredged material will be anchored around the lake perimeter and the area will be planted to stabilize the shoreline and restore the lakes natural appearance. Loss of lake depth through the deposit of sediment is detrimental to water quality and consequently, the wildlife that use this resource.
