## Civic Center Facilities Strategic Plan

## Revision No. 1 (9/25/18)

On April 25, 2017, the Orange County Board of Supervisors adopted the County of Orange Civic Center Facilities Strategic Plan ("Civic Center FSP"), attached hereto, which outlines a long-term strategic plan for the County's Civic Center within the City of Santa Ana. The Civic Center FSP is comprised of four phases that addressed the stated goals and objectives outlined therein. With Phase 1 underway, the Board of Supervisors is considering the commencement of Phase 2 of the Civic Center FSP and as part of that action has proposed certain revisions to the Civic Center FSP, as more fully outlined below.

In August of 2018 an Addendum to the previously certified Environmental Impact Report ("EIR") (State Clearinghouse No. 2016081044) ("Addendum No. 1") for the approved Civic Center FSP ("2017 Approved Project") was prepared to addresses these minor changes to the phasing and construction in Phases 1 and 2 of the Civic Center FSP.

The following changes to the 2017 Approved Project reflecting revisions to the Civic Center FSP are covered in Addendum No. 1:

A reduction of 36,201 net new building square feet within Phases 1 and 2 of the Civic Center FSP (including new Buildings 14, 16 and 18), total renovation would be reduced by 43,160 square feet, demolition would increase by 38,420 square feet, and new construction would increase by 2,219 square feet.

Phase 1 will be completed by 2020 and includes demolition of Building 16 (38,420 square feet) and new construction of a Building 16 (248,177 square feet), a one-stop-shop (4,344 square feet), and Building 18 - a new event/conference center for County employees - (6,214 square feet). Compared to the 2017 Approved Project, the 2018 Proposed Project would result in a reduction of 71,519 square feet of demolition and an increase in 515 square feet of new construction, resulting in an increase in 72,034 square feet of net new construction during Phase 1.

Phase 2 is planned to occur from 2019-2022. The demolition of Building 11 (109,939 square feet) would move from Phase 1 to Phase 2. Additionally, Phase 2 includes the construction of a new Board meeting room (15,000 square feet in Building 14), resulting in 1,704 square feet increase in new building construction in the Civic Center FSP. Due to the increase in demolition during Phase 2, the net new construction would be reduced by 108,235 square feet. As set forth in Addendum No. 1, the changes do not impose an environmental impact

Phases 3 and 4 would remain the same as the 2017 Approved Project.

Table 1 outlines the changes from the 2017 Approved Project that will become effective upon Board approval of this Revision No. 1 to the Civic Center FSP:
