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# AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO CONTRACT MA-080-23010374 FOR

ARCHITECT AND ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR CRITERIA DOCUMENTS PHASE 4 – CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION (CA), ORANGE COUNTY JUVENILE HALL – YOUTH TRANSITION CENTER (YTC)

This AMENDMENT is made and entered into as of the date fully executed by and between the County of Orange, a political subdivision of the State of California ("County") and Lionakis, a California Corporation ("A-E"), with County and A-E sometimes individually referred to as "Party" or collectively referred to as "Parties."

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, the County and A-E entered into Contract MA-080-23010374(the "Contract") for Architect And Engineering Services For Criteria Documents Phase 4 – Construction Administration (CA), Orange County Juvenile Hall – Youth Transition Center (YTC), for three (3) years, with a maximum allowable compensation of \$2,063,234; and

WHEREAS, the Parties now desire to increase the amount of Contract by \$810,125; and

WHEREAS, the Parties now desire extend the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Parties now desire to amend scope of work; and

WHEREAS, the Parties now desire to add Exhibit G; and

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

## **ARTICLES**

1. Article 1.4 shall be amended as follows:

The term of this Contract is for four (4) years, commencing upon Board of Supervisor approval, WITH A MAXIMUM ALLOWABLE COMPENSATION OF TWO MILLION, EIGHT HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE THOUSAND, THREE HUNDRED AND FIFTY-NINE DOLLARS (\$2,873,359), except as permitted in Paragraph 1.5 below.

2. Attachment A, Section II shall be amended to include the following:

# C. Phase 2 Redevelopment of Juvenile Hall and Adult Re-Entry Center at former Youth Guidance Center

As per attached Exhibit G, provide for data collection, condition assessment, planning/programming sessions for master plan development support for the Phase 2 redevelopment of Juvenile Hall and Adult Re-Entry Center at former Youth Guidance Center. Juvenile Hall and Adult Re-entry Center the consultant will conduct programming meetings with internal agencies and project stakeholders to develop conceptual programs and plans for future facilities and projects. Work with Probation, OCPW and CEO to develop an overall master planning of both campus' based on work currently in progress and showing proposed best use of existing buildings and site to meet the needs of the residents and staff reflecting the County's vision for the campus. Use programming information to develop site and test fit

options and will incorporate the final layout of the Youth Transition Center and Adult Reentry Center projects. This team will develop a phased implementation plan with associated high-level rough order magnitude (ROM) cost models and phasing plan for use in requesting capital funds for next phase(s) of construction. May develop graphic material suitable for presentations to the community and the Board of Supervisors, as needed. The final master plan for each campus will include, not only updates from work completed from each current Phase I but will reflect current best practices in the industry for effective and therapeutic design solutions that ensure youth success while also providing a safe and secure environment for Probation staff.

- 1. Services include:
  - a. Meetings: User group and service provider meetings
  - b. Site/Building/Utilities Investigation: Visual inspection of existing conditions, and examination of existing as-built drawings
  - c. Accessibility Assessment and Analysis: Buildings/Parking/Site Amenities
  - d. Program Review and Conceptual Designs Building and Site Use
  - e. Conceptual Rough Order Magnitude (ROM) Cost Estimate
  - f. Proposed Phasing Plan for Implementation
  - g. Development of Presentation Graphics, as needed
- 3. Exhibit G shall be added as attached hereto.
- 4. All other terms and conditions of the Contract shall remain unchanged and with full force and effect.

Lionakis is pleased to submit this fee proposal for Facility Master Planning services for the Orange County Juvenile Hall Campus. Based on preliminary discussions, we believe this proposal reflects Orange County Public Works' expectations for the project.

We know that the MRC facility and planned YTC project are just the first steps in redeveloping the Juvenile Hall campus into a modern juvenile facility. With this Master Plan, Orange County and Probation intend to define the steps necessary to transform the campus into a state-of-the art facility that can ensure successful outcomes for the young people who live there. We propose Facility Master Planning Services as follows:

#### **SERVICES**

Services are divided into three distinct phases – Data Collection and Condition Assessment, Planning Sessions and Programming Meetings, and Master Plan Development. The attached workplan outlines expected tasks for each phase, lists estimated hours for each task, and provides associated fees.

We understand OCPW has as-builts for existing campus facilities and have assumed time to examine these files in addition to any other existing studies and available documents. Our team intends to visit the site to perform condition assessments of existing facilities and related systems and will review current work that has been completed. The subconsultant team will conduct assessments of building infrastructure, building systems and stand-alone utilities. These condition assessments will be used in meeting with project stakeholders to assist in making informed decisions regarding renovation, re-use or abandonment of existing buildings and work in place.

We will conduct programming meetings with internal agencies and project stakeholders to develop conceptual programs and plans for future facilities and projects. We will work with Probation, OCPW and CEO to develop an overall master plan that reflects the County's vision for the campus. We will use programming information to develop site and test fit options and will incorporate the final layout of the YTC project as developed by the Design/Build team. Our team will develop a phased implementation plan with associated high-level rough order magnitude (ROM) budget costs for use in requesting capital funds for construction. We will also develop graphic material suitable for presentations to the community and the Board as needed.

We anticipate that the final master plan will include, not only updates from work completed, but will reflect current best practices in the industry for effective and therapeutic design solutions that ensure youth success while also providing a safe and secure environment for Probation staff.
