1. Society of OC Emergency Physicians (OC Medical Association)

Michael Steven Ritter, MD has served as an emergency physician at Mission Hospital and Children's Hospital at Mission since 1996. He currently serves as the Director of Emergency Department Medical Education and served as the Medical Director of the Emergency Department from 2012 through 2018. Dr. Ritter currently serves as an Assistant Clinical Professor at the University of California Irvine, Department of Emergency Medicine. Dr. Ritter holds a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of California, Irvine. He completed his residency in emergency medicine at the University of California, Irvine Medical Center. The Orange County Medical Association recommends and supports the nomination of Dr. Ritter to serve as the Society of Orange County Emergency Physicians representative to EMCC. Dr. Ritter currently serves as Chair of the Emergency Medical Care Committee.

2. Board of Supervisors District 1

Arturo Pedroza earned a Bachelor of Science Degree from the University of Phoenix, a Master's Degree from the Keller Graduate School of Management. He has taught cardiopulmonary resuscitation for over 15 years and presently serves as an Adjunct Instructor in the PDCA Apprenticeship Program at Cerritos College since 2003 where he also serves as a Senior Risk Control Consultant. His experience includes over 15 years of experience in occupational safety including serving as a safety director for various contractors as well as working safety at the Disneyland Resort.

3. Board of Supervisors District 2

Lawrence (Larry) A. Grihalva serves as a full-time faculty professor of Emergency Medical Services and Health Information Technology at Saddleback College since 2011; as part-time Emergency Medical Services Coordinator for Costa Mesa Fire Department since March, 2017; serves as a practicing attorney after being admitted to the California State Bar in December, 1996; and serves as a senior chaplain with the International Fellowship of Chaplains. Mr. Grihalva has earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of California, Los Angeles, a Juris Doctor degree from Boston College School of Law; and attended Daniel Freeman's paramedic training program after which he earned his paramedic license in the State of California. He has conducted presentations at fire departments, ambulance service providers, hospitals, and paramedic and EMT training programs with a focus on the legal and ethical aspects of prehospital care.

4. Board of Supervisors District 3

Timothy A. Munzing, MD serves as a staff Family Physician in the Southern California Permanente Medical Group (Kaiser); as a Professor and inaugural faculty member of the Kaiser Permanente School of Medicine where he has served as the Program Director of the Orange County Family Medicine Residency Program; as a Medical Expert Reviewer for the Medical Board of California; and as a Tactical Diversion Squad Consultant (Medical Expert Reviewer Consultant for the Drug Enforcement Administration). Dr. Munzing earned a Bachelor of Science degree from California State University, Fullerton and his Doctor of Medicine degree from the University of California, Los Angeles. He completed his internship and residency at Kaiser Foundation Hospital in Los Angeles specializing in Family Practice. Dr. Munzing serves as a volunteer for Latino Health Access/Lestonnac Medical Clinic and with the Illumination Foundation.

5. Board of Supervisors District 4

Luis Estevez serves as the Deputy City Administrator Public Services and Infrastructure for the City of Placentia. He coordinated and led certain aspects of the transition from the Orange County Fire Authority to the City's new Fire and Life Safety Department and the Advanced Life Support (ALS) Emergency Medical Services (EMS). Prior to his appointment he served as the Acting Deputy City Administrator and the Director of Public Works. He has served as the Deputy Director of Public Works for the City of Seal Beach and the City of Lake Forest. Mr. Estevez earned his Bachelor of Arts Degree from California State University, Fullerton, and a Master's Degree from California State University, Long Beach.

Dr. Heyming earned a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of California, Riverside and his Doctor of Medicine from the University of California, Los Angeles. He completed his emergency medicine residency at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center where he also completed a Fellowship in Pediatric Emergency Medicine .

7. American Red Cross

Rebecca (Becky) D. Firey serves as the Executive Director of the American Red Cross of Orange County, a position she has held since April 2020. As its executive director, she serves as the face of the American Red Cross in Orange County with the goal to maximize the presence of the American Red Cross and to expand its recognition and contributions to the community. Ms. Firey joined the American Red Cross as the Account Manager for the American Red Cross Blood Services in San Diego County in 2005. 10. Orange County Fire Chiefs

Adam R. Loeser is the Fire Chief for the Cities of Brea and Fullerton Fire Departments, a position he has held since January 2019. As Fire Chief, he serves as a member of the Orange County Fire Chiefs' Association. Chief Loeser joined Fullerton Fire Department in March, 2002, and has served in many capacities including firefighter, paramedic, engineer, shift training officer, and captain. In April, 2013, he was promoted to Battalion Chief with the management integration of Fullerton and Brea Fire Departments. In April, 2014, Chief Loeser was promoted to Division Chief of the Training Division. Prior to his appointment as Fire Chief, he became the Deputy Chief of Operations in April, 2018. Chief Loeser earned an Associate Degree in Fire Technology from Santa Ana College and a Bachelor of Arts from the University of Hawai'i.
