

**AMENDMENT NO. 3  
 TO  
 CONTRACT MA-012-23010125  
 FOR  
 OCEAN LIFEGUARD SERVICES FOR COASTAL OPERATIONS**

This AMENDMENT is made and entered into as of the date fully executed by and between the County of Orange, a political subdivision of the State of California (“County”) and US Ocean Safety, Inc. dba OC Lifeguards, with a place of business at 34127 Pacific Coast Highway, Dana Point, CA 92629 (“Contractor”), with County and Contractor sometimes individually referred to as “Party” or collectively referred to as “Parties”.

**RECITALS**

WHEREAS, County and Contractor entered into Contract MA-012-23010125 for Ocean Lifeguard Services for Coastal Operations, effective January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023, in the Total Contract Not to Exceed Amount of \$9,442,168.75, (“Contract”); and,

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2023, County and Contractor executed Amendment No. 1 modify Attachment A, Scope of Work and Attachment B, Payment and Compensation with a new Total Contract Not to Exceed Amount of \$6,122,945.41; and,

WHEREAS, on December 14, 2023, County and Contractor executed Amendment No. 2 to modify Article 12 “Cooperative Contract” of the Contract; and,

WHEREAS, the Parties now desire to amend Attachment B, Payment and Compensation and increase the Contract with a new Total Contract Not to Exceed Amount of \$6,738,239.32; and,

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

**AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT ARTICLES**

1. Attachment B, Section 2 shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:
2. **Fees and Charges:** County will pay the following fees in accordance with the provisions of this Contract. Payment shall be as follows:

\*Annual Consumer Price Index (CPI) increase, including any extensions, shall not exceed 2.5% per year.

\*\*Total for Year 1 includes all service areas for January and February 2023.

Contractor shall submit separate invoices on a monthly basis for each service location.

**A. Invoices shall include an overall monthly cost and be broken down as follows:**

- a. Labor – include staffing hours deployed for each location
- b. Equipment and Supplies
- c. Training and Professional Development
- d. Insurance

\* If the contracting party is a corporation, (2) two signatures are required: one (1) signature by the Chairman of the Board, the President or any Vice President; and one (1) signature by the Secretary, any Assistant Secretary, the Chief Financial Officer or any Assistant Treasurer. The signature of one person alone is sufficient to bind a corporation, as long as he or she holds corporate offices in each of the two categories described above. For County purposes, proof of such dual office holding will be satisfied by having the individual sign the instrument twice, each time indicating his or her office that qualifies under the above described provision. In the alternative, a single corporate signature is acceptable when accompanied by a corporate resolution demonstrating the legal authority of the signator to bind the corporation.
